

NEXT UP

- ▶ LSU (9-3, 5-3 SEC) appears in its first New Year's Year Six Bowl on January 1 when the 11th-ranked Tigers face No. 8 UCF in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl at State Farm Stadium in Glendale, Ariz.
- ▶ LSU will be making its first appearance in the Fiesta Bowl, while also playing UCF for the first time.
- ▶ LSU's appearance in the Fiesta Bowl will mark the 50th bowl game in school history and the Tigers are 25-23-1 all-time in bowl games.
- ▶ LSU's 50 bowl appearances rank as the eighth-highest total among all FBS teams, while the Tigers' 25 victories stand as the 10th highest total in college football.
- ▶ LSU is also appearing in a bowl game for the 19th straight season, a streak that stands as fourth-longest in college football trailing only Virginia Tech (26), Georgia (23) and Oklahoma (20).
- ▶ Against UCF, the Tigers will face a Top 25 team for the eighth time in 2018. The Tigers are currently 4-3 against Top 25 teams, which includes three victories over Top 10 teams.
- ▶ LSU is one victory shy of its first 10-win season since 2013 when the Tigers posted a 10-3 mark. Overall, LSU has 14 seasons in which they have won at least 10 games.
- ▶ LSU has beaten three Top 10 teams only three times in the same season three times in school history (2018, 2011, and 1982). LSU has never beaten four Top 10 teams in the same season.
- ▶ Ed Orgeron, who took over the Tigers four games into the 2016 season, is 24-9 as LSU's head coach.
- ▶ Over his last 41 games as a head coach, Orgeron is 30-11. That record includes a 6-2 mark as interim head coach at Southern Cal in 2013 and a 24-9 record at LSU.
- ▶ LSU is 7-0 this year when outrushing its opponent. Under Coach O, the Tigers are 22-2 when rushing for more yards than its opponent with the only two losses during that span coming against Florida in 2016 and Alabama in 2017.
- ▶ LSU is 15-1 under Orgeron when the Tigers feature a 100-yard rusher (6-0 in 2016, 5-0 in 2017, 4-1 in 2018 with the only loss being the 7-OT game against Texas A&M).
- ▶ LSU has allowed only 2 first quarter TDs (Alabama, Texas A&M) all season. The Tigers have outscored opponents 97-22 in the first quarter this year.
- ▶ LSU LB Devin White claimed the 2018 Butkus Award as the top linebacker in college football. White finished with 115 tackles and 12.0 tackles for loss.
- ▶ LSU S Grant Delpit became just the 9th player in school history to earn consensus All-America status in 2018.
- ▶ For first time in school history, LSU produced three consensus All-Americans in the same season this year (White, Delpit, CB Greedy Williams).
- ▶ LSU's "DBU" leads the SEC and ranks No. 12 in the nation in interceptions with 16. Nine players have at least one interception this year.
- ▶ LSU leads the SEC and ranks No. 7 nationally in turnover margin at +12. LSU has gained 23 turnovers (16 interceptions, 7 fumbles), while turning the ball over only 11 times (4 interceptions, 7 fumbles).
- ▶ Joe Burrow is 9-3 as LSU's starting quarterback and he joins Alan Risher (1982) as the only QBs in school history to have three wins over Top 10 teams in the same season.
- ▶ Burrow is one win away from joining Zach Mettenberger (10-3 in 2012) as the only QBs in school history to win 10 games in their first season as a starter.
- ▶ Burrow is the first player in LSU history with 2,500 passing yards and at least 350 rushing yards in the same season.
- ▶ RB Nick Brossette leads ranks No. 2 in the SEC in rushing TDs with 14 and he's No. 8 in rushing yards with 922 (76.8 per game).
- ▶ LSU PK Cole Tracy ranks first among all active collegiate kickers with 93 career field goals. The graduate transfer kicked 68 at DII Assumption College and now has 25 to his credit at LSU, which leads the SEC and ranks No. 2 in the nation.
- ▶ S Grant Delpit leads the SEC and ranks No. 9 in the nation in interceptions with 5. He also among the league leaders in passes defended (No.2 with 14) and sacks (No. 15 at 5.0).

Ed Orgeron grew up a Tiger fan. He developed a passion for the Tigers at an early age, becoming a fan of some of the all-time LSU greats in the 1970s. Players like Bert Jones, Ronnie Estay, Tommy Casanova and Charles Alexander ignited a purple and gold fire under Orgeron that still burns today.

Now in his second full season as head coach of the Tigers, Orgeron has leveraged his passion and love for LSU into a determination and drive that sees him spend nearly every waking moment focused on LSU football and his vision for the program. Winning championships will always be the goal for the program, but it's what Orgeron and his staff are doing to develop and mentor players off the field, in an atmosphere that fosters inclusion and accountability, that will ultimately set Tigers apart.

His quick impact on the LSU program was evident in 2016 when he was elevated from defensive line coach to interim head coach just four games into the season. The results were immediate and impressive, turning a 2-2 team with little confidence following a loss at Auburn, into a squad that played with swagger and energy. Orgeron earned the title of permanent head coach on November 26, 2016, two days after LSU beat Texas A&M, 54-39, to wrap up the regular season with a 7-4 mark, which included a 5-2 mark under Coach O.

With a "One Team, One Heartbeat" motto and high-energy practices that focus on being crisp and efficient, the players have bought into the Orgeron system, both on and off the field and the results are hard to ignore. Orgeron has guided the Tigers to a 24-9 overall mark in his 33 games as the LSU head coach. Of his 33 victories, 10 have come against teams ranked in the Top 25, including four over Top 10 opponents. Furthermore, of Coach O's 24 wins, 15 have come against SEC foes and 19 have come by double-digits.

In 2018, Orgeron guided the Tigers to a 9-3 overall mark with three of the nine victories coming against Top 10 teams. With a roster that featured as many as 17 players getting their first career start in 2018, the Tigers played most of the season ranked among the Top 10 teams in the nation and earned a berth in the Fiesta Bowl, the school's first appearance in a New Year's 6 Bowl.

Orgeron, an accomplished recruiter considered as one of the best in nation in not only identifying talent, but also signing those players, is building a roster that have the Tigers competing for championships on an annual basis.

The Coach O Way

With the "One Team. One Heartbeat" motto, the Tigers seemingly became a different team overnight under Orgeron and the results that LSU sought soon followed. As the head coach of the Tigers, Orgeron said he was going to "flip the script" and he assigned a theme for the daily practices. The purpose of the descriptive practice themes for each day during the week is one of the ways that Orgeron and his staff hold the players accountable and focused both prior to and during the workout. The daily practice nicknames are as follows: Tell the Truth Monday, Competition Tuesday, Turnover/No Turnover Wednesday, No Repeat Thursday, and Focus Friday.

Orgeron has also opened the doors for former LSU players to come back and be active in the program. Having former players actively involved is a way for the current Tigers to get a better understanding of who helped build the foundation for the program, while also letting them see first-hand what it means to be a LSU Tiger and the responsibility that goes along with it.

Offseason Moves

Coach O bolstered his staff during the offseason with the promotion of Steve Ensminger to offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach. It will be Ensminger's second stint as offensive coordinator under Orgeron as he held that spot for eight games during the head coach's transition year in 2016. Under Ensminger, LSU's offense thrived, setting numerous records and proving that he is the right man for the job.

He also added longtime NFL veteran and former LSU assistant Jerry Sullivan to the staff on a fulltime basis as the senior offensive assistant and passing game coordinator. James Cregg, another coach with NFL experience, joined the staff and his impact has already paid off as the offensive line is expected to be one of the strengths for the Tigers this year. Defensively, Bill Busch, who spent three years working alongside Dave Aranda at Wisconsin and Utah State, joined the Tiger staff as safeties coach. Greg McMahon, who won a Super Bowl with the Saints and spent 11 years coaching special teams for the franchise, was elevated from analyst in 2017 to LSU's special teams coordinator in 2018.

Orgeron Coaching History

Orgeron, a native of Larose, Louisiana, is LSU's 33rd head football coach, and the first Louisiana native to serve as head coach of the Tigers since West Monroe native Jerry Stovall held the position for four seasons in the early 1980s.

Orgeron, who has also served as head coach at Ole Miss and Southern Cal, is 15-6 at LSU. His career mark as a collegiate head coach is 40-33, however he's 30-11 8 over his last 41 games. Orgeron went 6-2 as Southern Cal's interim head coach in 2013, taking over a USC team that stumbled to a 3-2 mark over the first five games of the year. Orgeron rallied the Trojans as USC closed out the regular season with wins in six of its final eight games.

In his first game as LSU's permanent head coach, Orgeron guided the Tigers to a 29-9 win over No. 13 Louisville and its Heisman Trophy quarterback Lamar Jackson in the Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl.

Orgeron originally joined the Tiger staff in 2015 as defensive line coach, before adding the title of recruiting coordinator in the spring of 2016.

Prior to joining the LSU staff, Orgeron's last coaching stop came at Southern Cal where he served as recruiting coordinator and defensive line coach for the Trojans for four years (2010-13). Orgeron was elevated to interim head coach at USC for the final eight games of the 2013 season, leading the Trojans to a 6-2 mark over that span.

Orgeron served two stints at Southern Cal, the first as the Trojans' defensive line coach from 1998 to 2004. Orgeron coached under Paul Hackett at USC for three years from 1998 to 2000 and was one of just a handful of coaches retained by Pete Carroll when he took over as the Trojans' head coach in 2001.

He added the title of recruiting coordinator for USC in 2001 and helped the Trojans to top five signing classes for three straight years from 2002-04. Rivals.com and Sporting News named him the 2004 National Recruiter of the Year.

Orgeron left USC in 2005 to become the head coach at Ole Miss, where he went 10-25 in three years with Rebels from 2005-07.

Orgeron spent the 2008 season coaching the defensive line for the New Orleans Saints and then joined Tennessee as defensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in 2009. He returned to Southern Cal following the 2009 season.

Orgeron made a name for himself as a top defensive line coach at the University of Miami from 1988-92, where he coached eight All-Americans, including NFL first rounders Cortez Kennedy, Russell Maryland and Warren Sapp. In 1988, he was a graduate assistant at Miami, working with the defensive line. During his tenure, the Hurricanes won the national championship twice (1989 and 1991), finished second in the AP poll once (1988) and third twice (1990 and 1992) while appearing in five New Year's Day bowls (1989 Orange, 1990 Sugar, 1991 Cotton, 1992 Orange, 1993 Sugar).

Orgeron also was a graduate assistant at Northwestern (La.) State, his alma mater, in 1984 and McNeese State in 1985, working with the defensive line at both schools, then was an assistant strength coach at Arkansas for two years (1986-87).

As a player, Orgeron was a four-year starter on the defensive line for Northwestern State, captaining the Demons as a senior in 1983. He received his bachelor's degree in liberal arts from Northwestern State in 1984. In 2007, Orgeron was named to the Northwestern State Top 100 Players which was part of the school's Centennial Football Celebration.

He starred in football, basketball and track at South Lafourche High in Galliano, La. On the big screen, Orgeron played himself in the 2009 Oscar-nominated movie, "The Blind Side."

Born July 27, 1961, he and his wife, Kelly, have three sons, Tyler, and twins Parker and Cody. Tyler is a member of the LSU football coaching staff, while twins Parker and Cody just completed their second season as part of the McNeese State football team. Parker is a starting wide receiver for the Cowboys, while Cody is the starting quarterback at McNeese.

LSU Celebrates 125 Seasons of Football In 2018

- ▶ LSU celebrated its 125th season of football in 2018.
- ▶ Started in 1893, LSU is one of college football's most storied programs, winning three national titles (1958, 2003, and 2007) and claiming 11 SEC championships (1935, 1936, 1958, 1961, 1970, 1986, 1988, 2001, 2003, 2007, and 2011).
- ▶ LSU is the 12th-winningest program in NCAA history by victories with 796 and the Tigers are No. 14 all-time in terms of winning percentage (.652). LSU has an all-record of 796-414-47 in 125 seasons.
- ▶ To honor the 125 seasons of LSU Football, players have worn a 125 patch on their jerseys and the logo was also painted on the field for all home games.

LSU Goes Bowling For School-Record 19th Straight Season

- ▶ LSU will make its 19th straight appearance in a bowl game – a school record – when the Tigers face UCF in the PlayStation Fiesta Bowl on Jan. 1.
- ▶ LSU has played in a bowl game each year since 2000. LSU's current streak of 19 straight bowl appearances ranks No. 4 nationally, trailing only Virginia Tech (26), Georgia (23), and Oklahoma (20).

Tigers Set To Make 50th Bowl Appearance

- ▶ The LSU football program will be making its 50th appearance in a bowl game when the Tiger face UCF on Jan. 1.
- ▶ LSU is 25-23-1 all-time in bowl games. Last year, LSU dropped a 21-17 decision to Notre Dame in the Citrus Bowl.

LSU vs. UCF

- ▶ LSU will meet UCF in football for the first time in school history when the teams meet in the Fiesta Bowl.

LSU's Fiesta Bowl History

- ▶ LSU will be making its first appearance in the Fiesta Bowl.
- ▶ The Tigers will also be the first team from the Southeastern Conference to participate in the Fiesta Bowl since the 2000 season when Nebraska beat Tennessee, 31-21.
- ▶ Tennessee is the last SEC team to win the Fiesta Bowl, beating Florida State, 23-16, to end the 1999 season.

LSU In Arizona

- ▶ The Tigers will be making just their third appearance in the state of Arizona for a football game.
- ▶ LSU is 2-0 in games played in Arizona. LSU's first game in Arizona came on September 6, 2003 when the Tigers posted a 59-13 win over Arizona in Tucson. In 2005, Hurricane Katrina forced LSU to move its game with Arizona State to Sun Devil Stadium where Tigers rallied for a 35-31 win over the 15th-ranked Sun Devils.
- ▶ LSU and Arizona State were scheduled to play that game in Tiger Stadium in 2005, however the devastation in Louisiana due to Hurricane Katrina sent the Tigers to Tempe for the contest.

Fiesta Bowl Marks Furthest LSU's Traveled For a Bowl Game

- ▶ When the Tigers face UCF on Jan. 1 in the Fiesta Bowl, it will mark the farthest LSU's ever traveled for a bowl game.
- ▶ The Tigers had previously gone as far west as El Paso, Texas for the Sun Bowl in 1977 where LSU dropped a 24-14 decision to Stanford.
- ▶ LSU also appeared in the Sun Bowl in 1971, beating Iowa State, 33-15.

LSU Seeks 15th 10-Win Season in School History

- ▶ LSU goes into the UCF looking for its 10th victory of the season.
- ▶ The Tigers have had 14 10-win seasons in school history, most recently coming in 2013 when LSU posted a 10-3 mark.
- ▶ The school record for wins in a season is 13 set twice (2003 and 2011).

LSU In The Polls

- ▶ The Tigers bring a No. 11 national ranking into the Fiesta Bowl. The Tigers have spent the entire season ranked in the Top 25.
- ▶ LSU is currently ranked No. 11 in all three major polls - College Football Playoff, AP, and Coaches.
- ▶ Going back to last year, LSU has been ranked in the Top 25 of at least one of the three major polls for 24 consecutive polls.

LSU vs. Non-Conference Foes

- ▶ LSU is 9-2 vs. non-conference opponents under Coach Orgeron.
- ▶ The Tigers are 4-0 vs. non-SEC teams this year after going 3-2 in 2017.
- ▶ LSU beat Louisville, 29-9, in the Citrus Bowl during the 2016 season.
- ▶ UCF will be the second Top 10 non-conference opponent LSU faces this year.
- ▶ The Tigers opened the season with a 33-17 win over then-No. 8 Miami in Arlington, Texas.

LSU vs. the American Athletic Conference

- ▶ LSU is 72-24-7 all-time against current members of the American Athletic Conference.
- ▶ The Tigers have only played four current members of the AAC – Tulane, Houston, Cincinnati, and East Carolina.
- ▶ LSU is 69-22-7 vs. Tulane, 2-1 vs. Houston, 1-0 vs. East Carolina and 0-1 vs. Cincinnati.
- ▶ LSU last played a member of the AAC in 2009 when the Tigers beat Tulane, 42-0, in Tiger Stadium. Tulane was a member of Conference USA in 2009.
- ▶ LSU's first game against a current member of the AAC came in 1897 when the Tigers dropped a 26-0 decision to Cincinnati.
- ▶ Technically speaking, the UCF contest will be LSU's first against an AAC opponent since the adoption of the league from the Big East in 2013.

LSU vs. Top 25 Teams

- ▶ UCF represents the eighth Top 25 team the Tigers will face this year.
- ▶ LSU is currently 4-3 against Top 25 teams in 2018, which includes a 3-1 record against teams in the Top 10.
- ▶ LSU's Top 25 wins have come against No. 8 Miami (33-16); No. 7 Auburn (22-21); No. 2 Georgia (36-16) and No. 22 Mississippi State (19-3).
- ▶ LSU losses were to No. 22 Florida (27-19), No. 1 Alabama (29-0) and No. 22 Texas A&M (74-72 in 70Ts).

Eight-Win Season Streak Extended to 19 – The Longest Streak Among Power 5 Schools

- ▶ With its win over Arkansas, LSU extended its streak of consecutive eight-win seasons to 19, which ties with Oklahoma as the longest such streak among Power 5 schools.
- ▶ The Tigers have won at least eight games every season dating back to 2000.
- ▶ Among all FBS teams, only Boise State has produced more consecutive 8-win seasons (20) than LSU.
- ▶ LSU's streak is also the longest streak in the history of the SEC, leading Tennessee 16 (1989-2004); Florida 14 (1990-2003); Georgia 13 (1997-2009); Alabama 13 (1971-83).

White Wins Butkus Award - 25th National Award in School History

- ▶ LSU junior linebacker Devin White was named the 2018 Butkus Award winner, presented to the top linebacker in college football.
- ▶ White, who won the 34th-annual Butkus Award, is LSU's first winner of the award. It marked the school's 25th national award and the first since Odell Beckham Jr. claimed the Paul Hornung Award for the nation's most versatile player in 2013.
- ▶ White ranks second in the SEC in total tackles with 115 and his 12.0 tackles for loss stands 10th in the league.
- ▶ He is only the seventh player in LSU history to record 100 tackles in back-to-back seasons.
- ▶ Last season, White set an SEC record by being named the league's defensive player of the week four times. He led the SEC in tackles last year with 133, which ranks as the fourth-highest total in school history.

Delpit Becomes Program's Ninth Unanimous All-American

- ▶ Sophomore S Grant Delpit became only the ninth player in LSU history to earn unanimous All-America status this year as he picked up first team All-America honors from all five major organizations – AP, Walter Camp, Football Writers, Sporting News and American Football Coaches Association.
- ▶ Delpit was Finalist for the Nagurski Award.
- ▶ CB Morris Claiborne was the last LSU player to reach unanimous All-America status, earning the distinction in 2011.
- ▶ Heisman Trophy winner Billy Cannon is the only Tiger to do it twice in 1958 and 1959.
- ▶ Here's a list of LSU's all-time unanimous All-Americans: 1936, Gaynell Tinsley (E); 1958 & 1959, Billy Cannon (RB); 1961, Roy "Moonie" Winston (OL); 1962, Jerry Stovall (B); 1987, Nacho Albergamo (C); 2007, Glenn Dorsey (DT); 2011, Morris Claiborne (CB); 2018, Grant Delpit (S).

White, Williams and Tracy Earn All-America Honors

- ▶ For the first time in school history, LSU produced three consensus All-Americans in the same season when LB Devin White, S Grant Delpit, and CB Greedy Williams earned the distinction this year.
- ▶ Delpit was a unanimous selection earning first team All-America honors from AP, Walter Camp, Sporting News, Football Writers and American Football Coaches Association.
- ▶ White got first team recognition from AP, Walter Camp, Sporting News and AFCA.
- ▶ Williams received first team honors from Walter Camp, Football Writes and AFCA.
- ▶ Prior to this year, LSU had produced consensus All-America selections seven times, most recently in 2011 when CB Morris Claiborne and DB Tyrann Mathieu earned the honor.
- ▶ Other year in which LSU had two consensus All-Americans came in 1970 (DB Tommy Casanova, LB Mike Anderson), 1987 (C Nacho Albergamo, WR Wendell Davis), 1997 (OL Alan Faneca, P Chad Kessler); 2004 (C Ben Wilkerson, DE Marcus Spears), 2007 (DT Glenn Dorsey, S Craig Steltz), and 2010 (CB Patrick Peterson, K Josh Jasper).
- ▶ Overall, LSU has had 35 consensus All-America honors in its history.

LSU is 8-0 Under Coach O Following A Loss

- ▶ LSU goes into the Fiesta Bowl with an 8-0 mark under Coach Orgeron following a loss.
- ▶ The Tigers are coming off a 74-72 7OT loss to Texas A&M in the regular season finale.
- ▶ LSU hasn't lost back-to-back games since the 2015 season when the Tigers dropped three consecutive games during the month of November.

LSU Graduate List Up to 14 for Bowl Game

- ▶ At the Fiesta Bowl, 14 Tigers are going to take the field as a college graduate, 12 of which are LSU graduates.
- ▶ LSU's list of 14 college graduates includes three graduate transfers – CB Terrence Alexander (Stanford), QB Joe Burrow (Ohio State) and PK Cole Tracy (Assumption College).

Cole Tracy Continues To Make LSU History As LSU's Grad Transfer Kicker

- ▶ LSU graduate transfer kicker Cole Tracy put together one of the best seasons for a special teams player in school history.
- ▶ Tracy, who was a finalist for the Groza Award, led the SEC in field goals with 25 and he finished second in the league in scoring with 113 points.
- ▶ Overall, Tracy was 25-of-29 on field goals and a perfect 28-of-28 on PATs.
- ▶ His 25 field goals rank No. 3 in LSU history, while his 113 points stand at the fifth-highest total in school history ▶ Tracy tied the school-record with 5 field goals in LSU's 36-16 win over No. 2 Georgia.
- ▶ He followed that with 4 field goals in the win over No. 22 Mississippi State becoming the first player in LSU history to kick 9 field goals over a 2-game.
- ▶ Tracy's 18 points kicking (5 field goals, 3 PATs) were the most for a kicker in school history.
- ▶ Tracy gained national acclaim when he drilled a 42-yard field goal as time expired to beat No. 7 Auburn, 22-21.
- ▶ He became the first kicker to have a walk-off field goal in regulation in school history.
- ▶ In his LSU debut, Tracy tied the school record for longest field goal with a 54-yard field goal against Miami. That field goal tied Wade Richey vs. Kentucky (1996) and Ron Lewis vs. North Carolina (1985) for the longest in school history.
- ▶ He became the first LSU player to hit two field goals of 50+ yards in the first two games since Colt David in 2008 when he connected on a 50-yarder in the win over Southeastern Louisiana.
- ▶ Tracy closed out the year with another 50-yard field goal vs. Texas A&M running his total to three 50+ yard field goals in 2018.
- ▶ Overall, Tracy kicked nine field goals of 40 yards or more. Of his four misses, two came from 53 yards out (at Auburn, vs. Ole Miss), and one came from 49 yards. His other miss was a 33-yarder vs. Alabama.
- ▶ Prior to his 33-yard miss vs. Alabama, Tracy had made 47 straight field goals from less than 40 yards, which dates back to his days at Assumption College. Tracy's last miss of under 40 yards prior to 2018 came on September 3, 2016.
- ▶ Tracy goes into the Fiesta Bowl leading all active college kickers in field goals with 93. He kicked 68 field goals at Division II Assumption College before kicking 25 this year at LSU.
- ▶ Tracy earned first team All-SEC honors in 2018 as well as being a second team All-America pick from AP, Sporting News, Walter Camp and America Football Coaches Association.

Brossette After 1,000 Yard Rushing Season

- ▶ Nick Brossette goes into the UCF game just 78 yards shy of reaching 1,000 rushing yards this year.
- ▶ Brossette has rushed for 922 yards and 14 touchdowns on 211 carries.
- ▶ He's averaging 76.8 yards per game and 4.4 yards per carry. LSU has had players reach 1,000 yards 18 times in school history.
- ▶ LSU has had a player reach the 1,000-yard mark for five straight years dating back to 2014. Last year, Derrius Guice rushed for 1,251 yards.
- ▶ For his career, Brossette has rushed for 1,228 yards, becoming the 49th player in LSU history to rush for 1,000 yards for a career.
- ▶ This year, Brossette had nine touchdowns thru the first eight games, joining Leonard Fournette (15, 2015), Charles Scott (10, 2008) and LaBrandon Toefield (10, 2001) as the only players in school history to accomplish that in the past 25 years.

Burrow Shows Grit In Texas A&M Game – Accounts For 6 touchdowns Against Aggies

- ▶ LSU QB Joe Burrow showed true grit in the Tigers' game against Texas A&M in the regular-season finale playing every offensive snap in the 70T game.
- ▶ Burrow accounted for a school-record 6 touchdowns in the game (3 rushing, 3 passing).
- ▶ He carried the ball 29 times for 100 yards and connected on 25-of-38 passes for 270 yards.
- ▶ Burrow's 29 carries were the most by a LSU QB since 1943 when Steve Van Buren carried 43 times for 132 yards against LSU Army Specialists.
- ▶ Overall, Burrow racked up 370 yards of total offense and set the school record for total plays in a game with 67.
- ▶ Here's a look at the school marks or other noteworthy achievements by Burrow in the game against Texas A&M:
 - ▶ 6 touchdowns responsible for (3 pass, 3 rush) set the school record; previous was 5 set 7 times, last: Leonard Fournette (4 rush, 1 rec.) vs. Texas Tech in 2015 Texas Bowl (12/29/15).
 - ▶ 67 plays (38 pass, 29 rush) set the school record; previous was Josh Booty (58 pass, 3 rush) vs. Auburn in 1999.
 - ▶ 464 plays in 2018 (345 pass, 119 rush) set the school record; previous was Matt Flynn (359 pass, 100 rush) in 2007.
 - ▶ He recorded the ninth 100-yard rushing game by an LSU quarterback (29 att., 100 yds., 3 touchdowns).
 - ▶ 29 rushing attempts were the most by an LSU quarterback since 1943 (43 by Steve Van Buren), second-most in school history. The most by an LSU QB in recent history was 25 (Alan Risher vs. Tulane on 11/22/80).
 - ▶ 3 rushing touchdowns tied school record for most rushing touchdowns by a QB in a game (3; 5 times; last: Herb Tyler vs. Kentucky, 10/17/1998).
 - ▶ 7 rushing touchdowns in 2018 tied school record for most rushing touchdowns by a QB in a season (7; 7 times, last: Jordan Jefferson in 2010).

Texas A&M Game One For the Record Books

- ▶ Called the game of the year in college football, LSU's 74-72 7OT loss to Texas A&M in College Station on November 24 won't be forgotten anytime soon.
- ▶ The game featured 10 ties and 12 lead changes, consisted of 197 total plays (90 by LSU, 107 by Texas A&M) and last four hours and 53 minutes.
- ▶ In a contest that featured nearly 200 plays, there were only two turnovers (1 on special teams by LSU, 1 fumble by A&M).
- ▶ A&M finally won the game when they connected on a 2-point conversion to break a 72-72 tie in the seventh overtime.
- ▶ Here's a look at some of the records and other noteworthy accomplishments that night:

NCAA Records Set

- ▶ Most points, both teams, in NCAA Division I history (146); previous was 137 by Pitt and Syracuse (76-61) on 11/26/16.

LSU is towards the top once again when it comes to guys who are playing on Sundays. Forty players from LSU were on NFL rosters to start the season, which was second in the country.

2018 Tigers Look To Become First Team in LSU History With 4 Top 10 Wins In Same Season

- ▶ LSU goes into the Fiesta Bowl against No. 8 UCF needing one win to become the first team in school history to beat four Top 10 teams in the same season.
- ▶ This year, LSU has wins over No. 8 Miami (33-17), No. 8 Auburn (22-21) and No. 2 Georgia (36-16).
- ▶ The only other time in school history LSU beat three Top 10 teams in the same season came in 2011 and 1982.
- ▶ In 2011, LSU beat No. 3 Oregon, No. 2 Alabama and No. 3 Arkansas.
- ▶ In 1982, The Tigers took down No. 4 Florida, No. 8 Alabama and No. 7 Florida State.
- ▶ LSU was the first team in college football since 1976 to defeat two AP top-10 teams in the first four weeks of the season.
- ▶ This season LSU has four top-25 wins, which is the third-most in school history behind the 2011 (7) and 2007 (5) teams.

Burrow Sets LSU Single-Season Marks; Continues To Climb Passing Charts

- ▶ With seven rushing touchdowns and 464 total plays in 2018, junior QB Joe Burrow has made an immediate impact in his first season with the Tigers.
- ▶ In terms of season stats, Burrow now holds the LSU mark for total plays at 464 (345 pass, 119 rush) and he's tied the school mark for rushing touchdowns by quarterback with seven.
- ▶ Burrow stands as the first player in LSU history to throw for 2,500 yards and rush for at least 350 yards in the same season.
- ▶ Currently with a 9-3 mark as LSU's starting quarterback, with a win against UCF, Burrow can join Zach Mettenberger as the only QBs in school history to win 10 games in their first season as a starter. Mettenberger went 10-3 in 2012 in his first year as LSU's starting quarterback.
- ▶ Burrow goes into the Fiesta Bowl having connected on 198-of-345 passes for 2,500 yards and 12 scores. He's also rushed 375 yards and 7 touchdowns.
- ▶ Burrow is two completions shy of becoming seventh player in school history to complete 200 passes in a season.
- ▶ Burrow put together two of the Top 10 game in terms of total offense in 2018, totaling 388 yards against Ole Miss and 370 against Texas A&M. The 388 yards vs. Ole Miss ranks No. 6 in school history, while the 370 vs. the Aggies is No. 9 in the LSU record books.

LSU Managing Turnovers in 2018

- ▶ LSU owns a +12 turnover margin with seven forced fumbles and 16 interceptions.
- ▶ The defense's 16 interceptions are the most in the league and ranks No. 12 nationally.
 - ▶ Nine players have at least one interception for LSU this year, with Grant Delpit (5) and John Battle (3) leading way.
- ▶ The Tigers' +12 turnover margin is first in the league and seventh in the country.
- ▶ A year ago, LSU tied the NCAA mark for fewest turnovers in a season and set the school record with eight.
- ▶ Up until 2:21 remaining in the fourth quarter against Florida, LSU quarterbacks had thrown 250 consecutive passes without an interception. The streak dated back to November 4, 2017.
- ▶ Joe Burrow broke the school record for consecutive passes without an interception, throwing 158 passes before being intercepted against Florida. The previous mark was 137 held by Alan Risher.
 - ▶ Overall, LSU's offense has turned the ball over only 10 times (4 interceptions, 6 fumbles), while a fumbled punt vs. Texas A&M accounts for 11th turnover by the Tigers.

White Ranks Second in the League in Tackles

- ▶ The top linebacker in the country, junior Devin White has continued his top play in 2018.
- ▶ White owns 115 total tackles and averages 9.6 per game this season to rank No. 2 in the Southeastern Conference.
- ▶ White became the seventh LSU player with two or more 100-tackle seasons in school history.
- ▶ In the last two seasons, White has totaled 13 double-digit tackle games. He added his first of 2018 in week two against Southeastern with 11, finished with 11 against Louisiana Tech, added 13 against Georgia, totaled 10 against Mississippi State and set a career high with 17 against Texas A&M in the regular season finale.
- ▶ A year ago, White led the Southeastern Conference with 133 tackles. He became the first LSU player to lead the league in tackles since the mid 1980's when tackles became an NCAA stat.

White and Delpit Could Lead League in Tackles and Interceptions

- ▶ For the first time in SEC history, players from the same team could lead the SEC in tackles and interceptions in the same season as LSU LB Devin White and safety Grant Delpit are within reach.
- ▶ White is second in the league in tackles with 118 and Delpit is first in interceptions with five.
- ▶ The last time players from the same team led the SEC in tackles and interceptions in the same year came in 1993 when Ole Miss' Abdul Jackson (140 tackles) and Alundis Brice (7 interceptions) did it.

LSU Is 74-9 vs. Non-Conference Teams Dating Back to 2001

- ▶ Going back to the 2001 season when LSU captured its first outright SEC title since 1986, the Tigers have done quite well against non-conference opponents, going 74-9 against non-SEC foes during that span.
- ▶ Of the nine losses, only three have come during the regular season (2002 at Virginia Tech, 2016 vs. Wisconsin at Lambeau Field and 2017 vs. Troy).
- ▶ The other six losses have come in bowl games (2003 Cotton Bowl vs. Texas; 2005 Capital One Bowl vs. Iowa; 2009 Capital One Bowl vs. Penn State; 2012 Chick-fil-A Bowl vs. Clemson; 2014 Music City Bowl vs. Notre Dame and 2017 Citrus Bowl vs. Notre Dame)

Aranda's Named Semifinalist for Broyles Award; Defense Limits Offenses in First Quarter

- ▶ For the third-straight year, defensive coordinator Dave Aranda was a semifinalist for the Broyles Award, which goes to the nation's top assistant coach.
- ▶ In 12 games this season, Aranda's group has allowed just two touchdowns and three field goals in the first quarter.
- ▶ Overall, LSU's defense has allowed just 22 points this season in the first quarter.
- ▶ Texas A&M and Alabama are the only teams to score first quarter TDs against LSU this year ... Prior to the Alabama game on Nov. 3, LSU had gone 12 consecutive games without allowing a first quarter TD ... That streak dated back to the Alabama game in 2017.

Atkins' Leg Leaves No Doubt for Kickoffs

- ▶ True freshman walk-on Avery Atkins handles kickoff duties for the Tigers and has totaled 64 touch backs on 70 kicks.
- ▶ Atkins set the single-season touch back record in game eight against Mississippi State on his 46th kickoff.
- ▶ Against Georgia, Atkins gave the Tigers a short field when he recovered a fumble on the kickoff at the UGA 14.

Moreau Ranks Top-10 in Receptions by a Tight End

- ▶ Senior tight end Foster Moreau owns 50 receptions, 607 yards and six touchdowns for his career.
- ▶ Moreau, a native of New Orleans, ranks eighth in school history for receptions by a tight end.
- ▶ His six touchdown receptions for his career ranks fifth in school history.

Red-Zone Efficiency Significantly Improved

- ▶ LSU has significantly improved its red zone offense in 2018 with an 89 percentage in 55 trips.
- ▶ The offense, under coordinator Steve Ensminger, has 31 touchdowns in red zone and 18 field goals. The Tigers have punched it in 25 times on the ground and six in the air.
- ▶ In 18 games with Ensminger as the Tigers' coordinator, LSU is 73-of-82 on red zone opportunities (24-27 in 2016, 4955 in 2018).

19 of Coach O's 24 LSU Wins Have Come By Double-Digits

- ▶ Ed Orgeron has won 24 games as head coach of the Tigers with 19 of those coming by double-digits.
- ▶ All six of LSU's wins under Orgeron in 2016 came by double-figures and last year, the Tigers won six of their nine games by at least 10 points.
- ▶ This year, seven of LSU's nine wins have come by double-figures, including a 20-point win over No. 2 Georgia.

Offensive Line Uses Different Starting Lineup in Seven of Eight Games

- ▶ LSU started the same offensive line for the final four games of the season after using seven different combinations during the first eight games of the year.
- ▶ Due to injuries, LSU had a different starting offensive line for the first six games of the season.
- ▶ LSU started the same offensive line combination in back-to-back games for the first time all year in games against Florida and Georgia.
- ▶ LSU then used another combination on the line in game 8 against Mississippi State.
- ▶ Overall, through the first eight games of the season, LSU had seven different starting lineups.
- ▶ The Tigers have since started the same offensive line over the final four games of the regular season, a unit that is expected to be on the field when the Tigers face UCF in the Fiesta Bowl.
- ▶ Up until the Georgia game in week seven, the Tigers' left tackle did not make consecutive starts ... Six different players have started this season on the offensive line.
- ▶ Lloyd Cushenberry, Damien Lewis, Badara Traore, Austin Deculus, Donavaughn Campbell and Chasen Hines are all first-time starters.
- ▶ RG Damien Lewis and C Lloyd Cushenberry are the only linemen to start every game for the Tigers.
- ▶ LSU opened the season with six different starting lineup combinations for the first time since 1986.

SEC Player of the Week Honors in 2018

- ▶ LSU players Joe Burrow, Grant Delpit, Jacob Phillips, Cole Tracy and Devin White have all earned SEC Player of the Week honors in 2018.
- ▶ Tracy became the first player in SEC History to earn special teams player of the week honor four times in one season after being named after Mississippi State.
- ▶ In the season opener, first-time starters Tracy and Phillips picked up award. Tracy was four-for-four on field goal attempts and tied the school record with a long kick of 54. Phillips recorded seven tackles and a pick six.
- ▶ In his first SEC road start, Burrow engineered an 11-point second half comeback. Tracy booted the first game-winning kick as time expired in school history and finished three-for-four overall.
- ▶ Burrow set career highs for rushing yards (96), passing yards (292) and total offense (388) against Ole Miss. His 388 yards of total offense ranks as the sixth-highest total in school history.
- ▶ Against Georgia, White was the catalyst of the defense that limited Georgia to season low for points (16), total yards (322) and rushing yards (113). Tracy tied the school record for kicks in a game with five and set a new school record for points with 18.
- ▶ Delpit picked up his first career SEC weekly honor after leading the Tigers in tackles with 10 and picking off Nick Fitzgerald twice. Tracy kicked four field goals and became the first player in LSU history to kick nine field goals over a two-game span.

LSU's Defense Rises To Occasion In Win over Georgia

- ▶ LSU's defense came up big against second-ranked Georgia, holding the Bulldogs to season-lows for points (16), total yards (322) and rushing yards (113).
- ▶ Georgia came into the game averaging 42 points and 485 total yards per game.
- ▶ LSU held the Bulldogs scoreless in the first half as the Tigers built a 16-0 halftime lead.
- ▶ The Tigers also forced four turnovers (2 interceptions, 2 fumbles) in the contest and recorded 4 sacks in the game.
- ▶ Georgia was 5-of-14 on third-down attempts and after pulling to within 19-9 in the third quarter, they managed just three first downs the rest of the way.
- ▶ Devin White led LSU with 13 tackles, while John Battle and Kristian Fulton each had interceptions.

LSU's No-Turnover, 2-Penalty Game Against Georgia a Rarity

- ▶ In LSU's 36-16 win over No. 2 Georgia, the Tigers didn't have a turnover and committed only two penalties
- ▶ It's the second time under Orgeron, the Tigers have played a game with no turnovers and only two penalties (Last year vs. Tennessee)
- ▶ Prior to that, the last time LSU played a game with no turnovers and only two penalties came in a 2005 win over Appalachian State
- ▶ The only other times it's happened since 1970 came in wins over Arkansas in 1997 and Auburn in 1973.

Former LSU Assistant Coaches Winless in Return to Tiger Stadium

- ▶ Six former LSU assistant coaches have returned to Tiger Stadium as head coaches.
- ▶ The group is a combined 0-10 in their return to Baton Rouge.
- ▶ The six former assistants are: Kirby Smart (0-1), Derek Dooley (0-3), Will Muschamp (0-2), Darrel Dickey (0-2), Bradley Dale Peveto (0-1) and Mack Brown (0-1).

Day Game or Night Game Makes No Difference for LSU

- ▶ LSU's tradition of night games in Tiger Stadium is like none other in college football.
- ▶ But, LSU's recent success in day games in Tiger Stadium has made playing afternoon games in Death Valley more appealing.
- ▶ LSU has won 16 of its last 17 day games in Tiger Stadium, a stretch that goes back to a 16-14 victory over Tennessee on Oct. 2, 2010.
- ▶ Since 2010, LSU's only daytime loss in Tiger Stadium came against Florida by a 16-10 count in 2016.
- ▶ Of LSU's 16 wins during this current stretch, nine have come against Top 25 teams and all 16 were over SEC opponents.
- ▶ Since 2000, LSU is 112-18 overall at home, which includes an 85-11 (.882) mark at night in Tiger Stadium and a 27-7 (.794) record during the day. From 1960-99, LSU posted a 12-19-3 mark in day games in Tiger Stadium.

- ▶ In the last 165 games, LSU's success is easy to predict when it comes to net rushing yards. Get to 100 yards rushing and LSU will more than likely win as the Tigers are 132-22 when that happens.
- ▶ Hold the opponent to fewer than 100 yards and the Tigers are 79-5.
- ▶ An even more telling stat is that when LSU rushes for 100-plus yards and holds the opponents to fewer than 100 yards, the Tigers are 78-0.

Tracy's Game-Winning Field Goal First In School History

- ▶ When Cole Tracy booted the 42-yard field goal at Auburn in week three of the season, it marked the first walk-off field goal in regulation in school history.
- ▶ While there have been field goals in overtime and with less than a minute on the clock, Tracy is the only player to do it with the clock expiring in regulation.
- ▶ Below is a list of LSU's game-winning field goals since 1941. For this purpose, a field goals is classified as a "game winner" if it served as the last points of a game and it came within the final two minutes of the contest or in overtime.

Louisiana's Foster Moreau Carries on No. 18 Tradition

- ▶ Senior tight end Foster Moreau was selected to continue the tradition of the prestigious No. 18 jersey. Moreau was presented with the jersey by coach Ed Orgeron in the first preseason meeting following a vote of the coaching staff and former LSU No. 18s.
- ▶ A native of New Orleans, Moreau was the final player to sign in the 2015 recruiting class. He is the second tight end to earn the honor. Richard Dickson wore the number in 2008 and 2009.
- ▶ Jersey No. 18 was born when, in 2003, quarterback Matt Mauck guided LSU to its first national championship since 1958. His number became synonymous with success -- both on and off the field -- as well as a selfless attitude that has become the epitome of being an LSU football player. After his final year with the Tigers, Mauck passed the jersey number down to running back Jacob Hester, who then helped LSU to another national title in 2007.

- ▶ At 28 years old, punter Zach Von Rosenberg is the sixth-oldest player in college football in 2018.
- ▶ Von Rosenberg played minor league baseball for six seasons before joining the team in the fall.
- ▶ James Stefanon of Colorado is the oldest player at 31 years old.

This is #NFLSU

- ▶ The 2018 season marked the fifth-straight year LSU led all of college football with players on opening day NFL rosters at 52.
- ▶ There were a total of 40 players on active rosters, which was second in the Southeastern Conference.
- ▶ Sixty-five LSU players have been selected in the NFL Draft over the past 10 years, which ranks No. 2 nationally. LSU is one of just three schools in college football to have 60 or more drafted players since the 2009 NFL Draft.
- ▶ Over the last decade, LSU has produced nine first round NFL Draft picks. The Tigers have had at least one player selected in the first round 11 of the past 15 years.
- ▶ Overall, 59 former Tigers have appeared on Super Bowl rosters, and LSU has had at least one Super Bowl in 39 of 52 championship games.

- ▶ Since 2007, LSU leads the nation in number of defensive backs selected in the NFL draft with 18, including six in the first round.

- ▶ Patrick Peterson is making his eighth Pro Bowl appearance to become one of just three players in NFL history to make it Pro Bowls prior to his 29th birthday. He's joined on that list by Barry Sanders and Jim Brown.

- ▶ Tigers Safeties Coach Bill Busch and UCF Defensive Line Coach Shane Burnham coached the 2017 season at Rutgers. Busch served as the co-defensive coordinator and defensive backs coach while Burnham was the defensive line coach.
- ▶ UCF Offensive Line coach Glen Elarbee was a graduate assistant at LSU in 2007.

2018 Game-By-Game Highlights

Week One - vs. #8 Miami (Fla.)

- ▶ LSU led Miami 27-3 at halftime. The 24-point lead at the half was the largest against a ranked opponent since Sept. 15, 2015 against Auburn when the Tigers held a 24-0 lead against the SEC West foe. It tied the fourth-largest halftime lead against a Top 25 team in program history.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** was 11-of-24 for 140 yards in his first game as a Tigers. His start marked the first time since 1959 that an LSU quarterback started his first game with the team. His first play from the line of scrimmage was a pass. It was the first time since 1989 that LSU completed a pass on its first offensive play of the season.
- ▶ Senior **Nick Brossette** earned his first 100-yard game, including touchdown runs of 1 and 50 yards. He finished the night with 125 yards on 22 carries.
- ▶ Kicker **Cole Tracy** and linebacker **Jacob Phillips** were named SEC Players of the week. Tracy played in his first game as a Tiger and went 4-for-4 on field goal attempts along with an LSU record-tying 54-yarder. Phillips recorded seven tackles, an interception and a quarterback hurry. The sophomore returned his first career interception 45 yards for a touchdown.
- ▶ The LSU defense held the Hurricanes to only 83 rushing yards and only 342 total yards.

Week Two - vs. Southeastern Louisiana

- ▶ The LSU defense pitched a shutout Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, 31-0, as the 11th-ranked Tigers forced three turnovers and held Southeastern Louisiana to 65 rushing yards.
- ▶ Kicker **Cole Tracy** continued his perfect start in 2018, making his only field goal from 50 yards. He became the first LSU kicker since 2008 to record 50-yard kicks in consecutive contests. He has made all five of his field goals and all seven PATs. The field goal was also the first 50-plus yard field goal by LSU in Tiger Stadium since Nov. 13, 2010.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** was 10-for-20 with 151 yards passing and two touchdowns. With the clock at 0:00 in the second quarter, Burrow threw a desperation pass into the endzone when a leaping **Stephen Sullivan** brought down the 40-yard pass to give LSU the 24-0 lead at the half. It was the first passing touchdown on the final play of a half since the Bluegrass Miracle in 2002 and the first in Tiger Stadium since 1989.
- ▶ The shutout was preserved with a **Greedy Williams** interception with 11:54 left in the first quarter. It was the seventh interception of Williams' career and the first of the season. It remained in tact again when Southeastern had a bad snap, and **JaCoby Stevens** recovered the ball at the SLU 18-yard line and ran it back 64 yards, which resulted in a touchdown four plays later by **Clyde Edwards-Helaire**, the first rushing touchdown of his career. The shutout was the first by LSU in Tiger Stadium since Sept. 13, 2014, when LSU blanked UL-Monroe 31-0.
- ▶ Linebacker **Devin White** led the LSU defense for the second consecutive game, recording 11 tackles, one tackle for loss and one forced fumble. His forced fumble was with 8:45 left in the first quarter, and it was recovered by **Andre Anthony**. Following the fumble recovery, the Burrow connected with **Ja'Marr Chase** to culminate the 34-yard drive and gave the Tigers the early 7-0 lead. The touchdown was the first touchdown for both the quarterback and the wide receiver.

Week Three - at #7 Auburn

- ▶ With the clock at 0:00, kicker **Cole Tracy** continued his excellent start in his LSU career, connected on a 42-yard field goal to seal the 22-21 win on The Plains. The 42-yarder was one of his three made field goals in the game. The graduate transfer also booted an extra point.
- ▶ The walk-off score was the first one since Drew Alleman kicked the game-winning field goal on Nov. 5, 2011 at Alabama in the "Game of the Century" and was the first one in regulation since Oct. 2, 2010, when Stevan Ridley ran for one yard on the final play of the game against Tennessee.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** was 15-of-34 passing for 249 yards, including a 71-yard touchdown pass to wide receiver **Derrick Dillon** that pulled LSU within two points with 8:18 to play. The touchdown was the first of Dillon's career and was the longest catch of his career. On the final drive of the game, Burrow led the Tigers on a 14-play, 52-yard drive that used the final

- 5:38 of the clock and ended with a 42-yard field goal that split the uprights with the clock at 0:00.
- ▶ Safety **Grant Delpit** led LSU with 10 tackles, while linebackers **Devin White** and **Jacob Phillips** each had eight. Both Delpit and **Greedy Williams** had interceptions. Williams' interception was his second in as many games and was the eighth pick of his career.
- ▶ LSU out-gained Auburn, 370-328, converted 8-of-20 third downs and overcame a season-high nine penalties for 91 yards. Auburn also had nine penalties for 111 yards, including a key pass interference penalty that setup LSU's winning field goal. Save 21-straight points by Auburn in a 10-minute segment of the game spanning the second and third quarters, LSU's defense controlled the majority of the game. Auburn was held scoreless in the first 24:54 and the final 25:38 of the game.

Week Four - vs. Louisiana Tech

- ▶ Running backs **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** and **Nick Brossette** combined for five touchdowns to lift the No. 6 Tigers to 4-0 on the season with a 38-21 victory against Louisiana Tech. Edwards-Helaire rushed for 136 yards, making 2018 the 10th-consecutive season that LSU has featured multiple 100-yard game rushers. LSU's streak of 100-yard rushing games was extended to 21-straight as the Tigers ran for 218 yards.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** is now 4-0 as the Tigers' starting quarterback and finished the night 16-of-28 passing for 191 yards. With 0:35 left in the second quarter, Burrow was sacked and fumbled the ball. It was recovered by Louisiana Tech's Keonatyne Garner, marking the Tigers' first turnover of the season. Prior to the turnover, LSU was the only team in FBS that did not have a turnover this season. The Tigers had gone 20 consecutive quarters without a turnover.
- ▶ Linebacker **Jacob Phillips** paced the Tiger defense with a career-high 13 tackles, marking his first double-digit tackle game. Linebacker **Devin White** recorded his 10th double-digit tackle game of his career, posting 11 tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, one sack, three pass breakups and one fumble recovery.
- ▶ Safety **Ed Paris** intercepted a pass broken up by White, shortly after **Cole Tracy**'s ninth field goal of the season, a 24-yarder. The interception was the first of Paris' career and set up an Edwards-Helaire touchdown one play later.

Week Five - vs. Ole Miss

- ▶ LSU honored the 1958 National Championship Team by wearing numerals on the side of its helmets and romped to a 45-16 win against the Rebels. The game officially ended at 11:50 p.m. CST. It is the latest end time since start times and game durations have been kept consistently (1979). LSU had 33 first downs in the contest, marking the most first downs in a game since 1978.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** is now 5-0 as the Tigers' starting quarterback. He finished the night 18-of-25 passing for a career-high 292 yards and a career-best three touchdowns. Burrow also led the team in rushing with 96 yards on nine attempts and one touchdown. Burrow connected with nine different receivers including wide receiver Justin Jefferson who had a team-high five catches for 99 yards with touchdowns of 65 and 5 yards. - ▶ S **Grant Delpit** finished the night with five tackles, one sack, a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss, one interception, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry.

Week Six - at #22 Florida

- ▶ In a back and forth contest in The Swamp, No. 22 Florida scored with eight minutes remaining and held off the fifth-ranked Tigers, 27-19, Saturday. LSU suffered its first defeat of the 2018 season while facing three ranked teams away from Tiger Stadium in its first six games.
- ▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** set the school record for attempts without an

interception with 159. Prior to his first interception in the fourth quarter, he extended the streak to 275 consecutive passes without an interception, which dated back to the first quarter of the 2017 Alabama contest. Burrow was 19-of-34 passing for 192 yards. He was sacked five times for minus-30 yards, but finished with 22 net rushing yards. **Derrick Dillon** had a team-high four catches for 42 yards, while **Justin Jefferson** added three catches for 51 yards.

▶ LB **Micah Baskerville** led the Tiger defense with a career-best 11 total tackles. S **Grant Delpit** and S **John Battle** each also had 10-tackle games.

Week Seven - vs. #2 Georgia

▶ LSU honored the 1958 National Championship Team by wearing numerals on the side of its helmets and romped to a 45-16 win against the Rebels. The game officially ended at 11:50 p.m. CST. It is the latest end time since start times and game durations have been kept consistently (1979). LSU had 33 first downs in the contest, marking the most first downs in a game since 1978.

▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** is now 5-0 as the Tigers' starting quarterback. He finished the night 18-of-25 passing for a career-high 292 yards and a career-best three touchdowns. Burrow also led the team in rushing with 96 yards on nine attempts and one touchdown. ▶ S **Grant Delpit** finished the night with five tackles, one sack, a career-high 2.5 tackles for loss, one interception, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry.

Week Eight - vs. #22/RV Mississippi State

▶ The LSU defense shined in the 19-3 victory against Mississippi State as the Tigers recorded four interceptions on the night. Safety **Grant Delpit** had two of the four picks and recorded LSU's only sack of the night. He and Linebackers **Jacob Phillips** and **Devin White** also had double-digit tackle games.

▶ LSU running back **Nick Brossette** eclipsed 1,000 career yards and finished with 57 on 17 carries and the game's only touchdown, his 10th of the season.

▶ Placekicker **Cole Tracy** became the first Tiger to kick nine field goals in a two-game span, making all four of his attempts- 25, 38, 29 and 40 yards- and has 21 field goals so far in the 2018 season. He gave the Tigers field goals on four consecutive drives for the first time since 2010 and now is tied for third on LSU's single season field goal list.

▶ LSU wore a unique uniform for the contest, commemorating the 1918 "Silent Season", which was canceled due to World War I.

▶ Tracy and Delpit were named SEC Players of the Week for their performances. Delpit was also named the Bednarik Award Player of the Week, and punter **Zach Von Rosenberg** was named to the Ray's 8 Award, sitting ninth nationally in average punting yards. Delpit and cornerback **Greedy Williams** were also named semifinalists for the Thorpe Award.

Week Ten- vs. #1 Alabama

▶ For the 10th time in the new configuration, Tiger Stadium was at capacity at 102,321. The game was the fifth time that a pair of teams ranked in the top-five squared off in Tiger Stadium.

▶ The Tigers held Alabama in the first possession, and it was the first time this season that Alabama did not score a touchdown on its opening offensive possession.

▶ **Todd Harris Jr.** picked off Alabama quarterback Tua Tagovailoa for his first career interception and Tagovailoa's first interception of the season. It was the 11th-straight game in which LSU recorded a pick.

▶ Offensive lineman **Austin Deculus** blocked an extra point attempt in the third quarter. It was his second blocked kick of the season. Deculus is the first Tiger since 1999 when Clarence LeBlanc blocked a punt and a field goal to record two blocked kicks in the regular season.

Week 11 - vs. Arkansas

▶ For the 15th since 1996, LSU brought home the golden boot, winning three-straight contests against Arkansas and six of its last eight games.

▶ With the 24-17 win, LSU has won eight games for 19-straight seasons.

▶ Wide receiver Justin Jefferson tied his career-high with six receptions and set a career-best with 117 receiving yards, going over 100 yards for the second time in his career.

▶ Defensive back Kary Vincent Jr. had three tackles, one sack, one tackle for loss, one interception and two pass breakups. His interception was the second of his career and marked the 12th-straight game that the Tigers have recorded a pick.

▶ LSU recorded a scoring drive in the second quarter, which resulted in a rushing touchdown that took 7:24 off of the clock. It was the longest by time since Nov. 28, 2015 vs. Texas A&M (8:05).

▶ LSU recorded 164 rushing yards and held Arkansas to 16 yards rushing, making the Tigers 77-0 when rushing for 100 yards and holding opponents to less than 100 yards.

Week 12 - vs. Rice

▶ LSU out-gained Rice, 552-198, to take home the 42-10 win on Senior Night. There were 18 seniors honored in the contest in the final home game of the 2018 season.

▶ Tight end **Foster Moreau** recorded a career-high five catches for a career-best 73 yards and one touchdown. His five catches gives him 46 career catches, which put him in ninth overall for career receptions by a tight end.

▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** finished the night with a career-best 20 completions and a career-high 307 yards and two touchdowns. **Myles Brennan** entered the contest midway through the third quarter for his first game action of the season, completing 4-of-6 passes for 65 yards.

▶ Linebacker **Devin White** paced the Tiger defense with nine tackles, one sack, one pass breakup and one quarterback hurry. Safety **JaCoby Stevens**, linebacker **Michael Divinity** and linebacker **Jacob Phillips** each compiled seven tackles in the game.

▶ LSU's defense has not allowed 30 points in a game for 31 consecutive games. The defense also held Rice to 97 yards rushing, giving LSU a 78-0 overall record when rushing for 100 yards and holding opponents to less than 100 yards.

▶ Safety **Ed Paris** wore the No. 21 for the final time in Tiger Stadium. It was the final time an LSU player will garner the No. 21 in a game as Jerry Stovall's No. 21 was retired earlier in the season.

Week 13 - at Texas A&M

▶ LSU and Texas A&M combined to score 146 points in the school record and NCAA record 7 OT game in College Station. The 146 points were the highest combined points in NCAA Division I history.

▶ The game lasted for four hours and 53 minutes, marking the longest game by duration in LSU history. The previous long was the three-overtime game at Kentucky on October 13, 2007 which lasted four hours and 27 minutes.

▶ Quarterback **Joe Burrow** was responsible for six touchdowns in the game, setting the school record. He had three rushing and three passing touchdowns in the night and recorded the ninth 100-yard rushing game by a quarterback in school history.

▶ Running back **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** became the first player since Spencer Ware in 2010 to throw a passing touchdown in a non-QB position. He is only the seventh player since 1965 to record a passing touchdown by a non-QB.

▶ Linebacker **Devin White** earned SEC Player of the Week honors after leading the defense with a career-high 17 tackles, one sack, four tackles for loss and one forced fumble.



LSU has played in a bowl game for 19-straight seasons. The Tigers own a record of 11-7 in bowl games during the stretch, which began in 2000. LSU's current streak of 19-straight bowl appearances ranks No. 4 nationally, trailing only Virginia Tech (26), Georgia (23), and Oklahoma (20).

LSU won seven bowl games in the previous decade, cementing the Tigers as one of college football's elite programs. LSU has appeared in 13 Sugar Bowls, second-most of any team in America.

LSU Dominates Early, Storms Past No. 8 Miami, 33-17

No. 25-ranked LSU took a commanding 27-3 halftime lead and cruised to its second Top-10 victory under head coach **Ed Orgeron**, 33-17 over No. 8 Miami on Sunday night in AT&T Stadium. LSU (1-0), playing with 11 first-time starters, held the Hurricanes to 97 yards in the opening 30 minutes and led 33-3 entering the fourth quarter. Just before halftime, LSU sophomore linebacker **Jacob Philips** returned an interception 45 yards for a touchdown that put the Tigers in firm command of the contest. The Tigers, who committed a nation-best eight turnovers in 2017, continued to protect the football - and kept Miami's "Turnover Chain" in its case. Senior running back **Nick Brossette** earned his first 100-yard game including touchdown runs of 1 and 50 yards. The Baton Rouge native had 125 yards on 22 carries. Graduate transfer quarterback **Joe Burrow** led the Tigers to six scoring drives without committing a turnover. Burrow finished 11-of-24 passing for 140 yards, while rushing four times for 14 yards. Sophomore **Justin Jefferson** set career-bests with 81 yards on five catches. Another graduate transfer, senior **Cole Tracy**, made all four of his field goal attempts and tied a school record with a 54-yarder that skidded over the crossbar in the third quarter. Tracy also had makes from 43, 21 and 21 yards in his Division I debut. Miami outgained LSU, 342-296. LSU scored 10 points off two Miami interceptions and held the Canes to 83 net rushing yards on 34 attempts. The Tigers recorded four sacks of Miami quarterback **Malik Rosier**. Rosier led the Hurricanes with 259 passing yards but was pressured throughout the contest by the aggressive LSU defense.

No. 11 LSU Posts Shutout in Home Opener, 31-0

The LSU defense pitched a shutout Saturday night in Tiger Stadium, 31-0, as the 11th-ranked Tigers forced three turnovers and held Southeastern Louisiana to 65 rushing yards. LSU was led by running back **Nick Brossette**, who had 137 of LSU's 184 net rushing yards on 19 carries. Quarterback **Joe Burrow** completed 10-of-20 passes for 151 yards with two touchdowns. Burrow also ran for a touchdown, as did running back **Clyde Edwards-Helaire**. LSU placekicker **Cole Tracy** continued his perfect start in 2018, as the senior transfer made his only attempt from 50 yards. Linebacker **Devin White** recorded his ninth double-digit tackles game with a team-high 11, while true freshman **Micah Baskerville** made his debut and added six tackles in relief of **Jacob Phillips**. Phillips was ejected for targeting late in the first half. Nose tackle **Breiden Fehoko** was dominant up front, collecting six tackles including 2.5 behind the line of scrimmage. **Neil Farrell Jr.** came off the edge to make six tackles including 1.5 sacks. LSU had 10 tackles for loss in the game. **Greedy Williams** picked up his first interception of the season and added three tackles. LSU grabbed a 7-0 lead with 7:15 remaining in the first quarter when quarterback Joe Burrow connected with freshman wide receiver **Ja'Marr Chase** on a nine-yard touchdown pass. The aerial was the first TD throw of Burrow's LSU career and the first scoring reception of Chase's collegiate career. After a three-and-out by the Southeastern offense, LSU drove 46 yards in seven plays with the march ending on Burrow's one-yard TD run, giving the Tigers a 14-0 lead at the 3:20 mark of the first quarter. LSU increased its advantage to 17-0 with 11:21 remaining in the first half when placekicker Cole Tracy nailed a 50-yard field goal, his second 50+ yard three-pointer of the season. Tracy became the first LSU kicker since Colt David in 2008 to make 50+ yard field goals in consecutive games. Burrow hit wide receiver **Stephen Sullivan** on a 40-yard Hail Mary touchdown pass on the final play of the first half to give LSU a 24-0 lead at intermission. The play culminated a 96-yard, seven-play march and marked the second career TD reception for Sullivan. SLU mounted a scoring threat early in the fourth quarter, advancing to the LSU 21-yard line, but cornerback Greedy Williams picked off a Chason Virgil pass at the Tigers' 6-yard line to stymie the drive. Taking over at their 49, the Lions took advantage of the short field and marched to the LSU 3-yard line. However, a bad pass from center on third-and-goal was recovered by LSU's **JaCoby Stevens** at the SLU 18 and returned to the LSU 18. The last of four-consecutive rushes by Edwards-Helaire resulted in a 7-yard touchdown and gave LSU a 31-0 lead with 2:03 to play.

Tracy's Walk-Off Caps Comeback Win at No. 7 Auburn

Cole Tracy made a 42-yard field goal as time expired, as the No. 12-ranked LSU football team defeated No. 7 Auburn, 22-21, on Saturday on The Plains. LSU (3-0, 1-0 SEC) knocked off its second top-10 opponent - No. 8 Miami and No. 7 Auburn - in the first three weeks of the 2018 season, each away from Tiger Stadium. The last team to beat two AP top-10 teams in the first three weeks of a season was Missouri in 1976. LSU quarterback **Joe Burrow**, a transfer from Ohio State, earned his first SEC victory in one of the most hostile environments, as the visiting Tigers won at Auburn for the first time since 2012. Burrow was 15-of-34 passing for 249 yards including a 71-yard touchdown pass to **Derrick Dillon** that pulled LSU within two, 21-19, with 8:18 to play. On the final drive of the game, he led the Tigers on a 14-play, 52-yard drive that used the final 5:38 of the clock and ended with Tracy's 42-yard field goal that split the uprights with the clock at 0:00. The walk-off field goal was LSU's first in regulation since at least 1941. Running back **Nick Brossette** led LSU with 69 rushing yards on 19 carries, while Burrow had 22 net yards on 10 carries including a sack. Wide receiver **Justin Jefferson** had a team-best 97 yards on five catches, while Dee Anderson added 41 yards on three grabs including a key first-down catch-and-stretch to keep LSU's final drive alive. Tracy made 3-of-4 field goals with makes from 33, 27 and the game-winner of 42 yards. The miss - his only in nine attempts in 2018 - was from 53 yards in the first quarter. Save 21-straight points by Auburn in a 10-minute segment of the game spanning the second and third quarters, LSU's defense controlled the game. Auburn was held scoreless in the first 24:54 and the final 25:38 of the game. Safety **Grant Delpit** led LSU with 10 tackles, while linebackers **Devin White** and **Jacob Phillips** each had eight. Both Delpit and **Greedy Williams** had interceptions. LSU outgained Auburn, 370-328, held the ball for 10 minutes longer than Auburn, converted 8-of-20 third downs and overcame a season-high nine penalties for 91 yards. Auburn also had nine penalties for 111 yards, including a key pass interference penalty that setup LSU's winning field goal. Quarterback Jarrett Stidham led the Auburn offense, completing 16-of-28 passes for 198 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions. Redshirt freshman Jafarvious Whitlow had 104 rushing yards on 22 carries with a 7-yard touchdown run, while back Shaun Shivers had 25 yards and a 7-yard score. Darius Slayton caught a 4-yard touchdown pass on third-and-goal to give Auburn a 21-10 lead with 10:38 left in the third quarter. A 20-yard catch by Anderson turned into a 35-yard gain when a face-mask penalty was called. Following a 7-yard run for a first down by Brossette, wide receiver **Jonathan Giles** drew a pass interference penalty that gave LSU first-and-goal at the 8. When three plays netted one yard, LSU settled for a 27-yard Tracy field goal and trailed 21-13 with 3:58 to play in the third quarter. On the first play of the drive, Burrow got perfect protection and found Dillon streaking across the middle of the field. Burrow's lofted a pass just over the linebacker and into Dillon's hands in stride. Dillon sprinted untouched to the Auburn 10 before dodging a tackle and completing a 71-yard catch-and-run for a touchdown. LSU trailed 21-19 when its two-point pass attempt to Jefferson fell incomplete in the back of the endzone. With less than five minutes on the clock, the Tigers were able to get the ball to Auburn's 24-yard line. The final snap was a 42-yard field goal from Tracy, which ended the game 22-21.

Backs Combine for Five TDs in Victory Over Tech

LSU running backs **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** and **Nick Brossette** combined for 214 yards and five touchdowns, as the No. 6-ranked Tigers improved to 4-0 with a 38-21 victory over Louisiana Tech. After LSU jumped out to a 24-0 lead midway through the second quarter, Louisiana Tech (2-1) gave LSU all it could handle. The Bulldogs scored 21 unanswered points including a 42-yard touchdown pass from J'Mar Smith to Adrian Hardy with 12:57 to play. However, LSU responded with two touchdowns in a six-minute span, which sandwiched a defensive stop and turnover on downs in Bulldogs territory. Sophomore Edwards-Helaire had career-bests of 20 carries, 136 yards and two touchdowns, while Brossette tallied 78 yards on 20 carries and scored on runs of 1, 1 and 2 yards. LSU quarterback **Joe Burrow** completed 16-of-28 passes for 191 yards, as the Tigers amassed 409 yards of total offense. Burrow's 21-yard pass to freshman wide receiver **Ja'Marr Chase** setup Brossette's first touchdowns. Cornerback **Kristian Fulton** forced a fumble and linebacker **Devin White** returned it to the Louisiana Tech 3, leading to Brossette's second score on the first play of the second quarter. Following a **Cole Tracy** 24-yard field goal, LSU defensive back **Ed Paris** intercepted a pass broken up by White at the Bulldogs 28. On the next play, Edwards-Helaire scored to give LSU a 24-0 lead. Linebacker **Jacob Phillips** had a team-high 13 tackles, while White added 11 including 2.5 behind the line of scrimmage and three pass breakups. Safety **Todd Harris Jr.**, who started in place of **John Battle**, had nine tackles. Louisiana Tech quarterback J'Mar Smith finished 27-of-50 passing for 330 yards with three touchdowns and one interception. His top target was Adrian Hardy, who had 10 catches for 181 yards with touchdowns of 20 and 42 yards.

No. 5 Football Balanced in Ole Miss Blow-out, 45-16

Fifth-ranked LSU rolled up 573 yards of total offense - 292 through the air and 281 on the ground - in a 45-16 victory over Ole Miss on a rainy Saturday night in Tiger Stadium. LSU (5-0, 2-0 SEC) was led by quarterback **Joe Burrow**, who was 18-of-25 passing with three touchdowns while running for a team-best 96 yards and a touchdown. Burrow connected with nine different receivers including wide receiver **Justin Jefferson** who had a team-high five catches for 99 yards with touchdowns of 65 and 5 yards. **Stephen Sullivan** added five catches for 50 yards while **Racey McMath** had his first two career catches for 42 yards. Along with Burrow's 96 net yards rushing, running back **Nick Brossette** had 72 net yards with a 4-yard touchdown run late in the first quarter that put the Tiger ahead, 14-3. **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** added 67 net yards on 11 carries with a 3-yard touchdown run midway through the second quarter. LSU ran 50 times for 281 yards, converted 7-of-12 third downs and overcame two turnovers. The Tigers had 33 first downs - LSU's most since 1978 - and held the ball for 35:17. Though the Tigers' offensive line got a boot with the return of tackle **Adrian Magee**, LSU started its fifth different combination in as many games. Sophomore **Donavaughn Campbell** earned his first start at left guard in place of an injured **Garrett Brumfield**. Defensively, LSU held the Rebels in check throughout the contest, beginning with a diving interception by safety **Grant Delpit** on Ole Miss' second play from scrimmage. Cornerback **Greedy Williams** led the Tigers with 10 tackles, while Delpit had five including 2.5 behind the line of scrimmage. Linebackers **Devin White** and **Jacob Phillips** collected six tackles each. Saturday's 8:15 p.m. CT kickoff led to the latest ending time for an LSU home game officially recorded (since 1979). Ole Miss (3-2, 0-2 SEC) committed 17 penalties for 167 yards, the highest by an LSU opponent on record (since 1937). Rebels quarterback Jordan Ta'amu was 19-of-38 passing for 178 yards. Ole Miss running back Scottie Phillips ran 16 times for 96 net yards with a 1-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter.

No. 5 Football Suffers First Loss, 27-19

In a back-and-forth game in The Swamp, No. 22 Florida scored with eight minutes remaining and held off the fifth-ranked Tigers, 27-19, on Saturday. LSU (5-1, 2-1 SEC) suffered its first defeat of the 2018 season while facing three ranked teams away from Tiger Stadium in its first six games. Florida improved to 5-1 overall and 4-1 in SEC play. With 11:14 remaining, LSU took a 19-15 lead after running back **Nick Brossette's** second touchdown of the game. However, the Tigers two-point attempt was batted away and Florida answered with a nine-play, 75-yard drive to take earn a 20-19 lead. Florida earned the final margin with 1:45 to play when **Joe Burrow** threw his first interception in 160 pass attempts as a Tiger. Florida's Brad Stewart Jr. returned it 25 yards for a touchdown. Brossette netting 95 rushing yards on 15 carries, while **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** added 55 yards on 13 carries. Burrow was 19-of-34 passing for 191 yards. He was sacked five times for minus-30 yards, but finished with 22 net rushing yards. **Derrick Dillon** had a team-high four catches for 42 yards, while **Justin Jefferson** added three catches for 50 yards. In a statistically-even contest, Florida outgained LSU, 391-371. LSU had three turnovers while Florida had one.

LSU Runs Over No. 2 Georgia in Overflow Tiger Stadium

Georgia walked into a raucous cage Tiger fans call Death Valley on Saturday afternoon wearing its SEC title belt, undefeated and ranked second in the nation. The 2017 national runners-up left with their first loss, an emphatic 36-16 beat down by an inspired 13th-ranked LSU football team. In front of a sold-out Tiger Stadium which overflowed onto the field following the final whistle, LSU (6-1, 3-1 SEC) recorded its third AP Top-2 victory in stadium history - 1997 versus No. 1 Florida and 1961 versus No. 2 Ole Miss. After suffering its first loss on the road to then-No. 22 Florida last Saturday, LSU whipped Georgia to the tune of 475 yards - 275 on the ground and 200 through the air. The Tigers were plus-four in turnover margin, converted 4-of-4 fourth downs (for the first time since 2007 game vs. Florida) and possessed the ball for nearly 34 minutes. LSU quarterback **Joe Burrow** finished 15-of-30 passing and added 66 rushing yards on 13 attempts, including a 59-yarder to the Georgia 4 when the Tigers were attempting to run out the clock on the statement victory. Sophomore running back **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** had 145 rushing yards on 19 carries, while senior **Nick Brossette** had 64 yards on 16 carries including a 4-yard touchdown run that capped off Burrow's long scamper. Wide receiver **Justin Jefferson** had a career-high 108 receiving yards on six catches. Senior placekicker **Cole Tracy** scored half of LSU's 36 points, making all five of his field goals (33, 36, 39, 24, 30) and all three PAT's. His 18 kicking points are an LSU record (since 1949). LSU's defense stepped up with its most complete performance of the season, holding a powerful Georgia offense to 322 yards including 113 on the ground and 209 through the air. Linebacker **Devin White** had a game-high 13 tackles, safety **John Battle** added eight, and **Kary Vincent Jr.**, **Grant Delpit** and **Michael Divinity Jr.** each had seven. Georgia managed only 36 rushing yards in the second half, as LSU built a 16-0 halftime advantage and forced Bulldogs quarterback Jake Fromm into passing situations. Fromm finished 16-of-34 passing for 209 yards with a 27-yard touchdown pass to Riley Ridley in the fourth quarter and two interceptions. Bulldogs running back D'Andre Swift had 72 rushing yards while Elijah Holyfield added 56 on seven carries including a 10-yard touchdown run in the third quarter that pulled Georgia within 10, 19-9. LSU's special teams also came through in a big way, forcing a fumble on a sniffed-out fake field goal in the first quarter and another recovered on a kickoff by Tigers freshman placekicker **Avery Atkins** at the Georgia 14.

LSU Defense Shines in 19-3 Win Over No. 22 MSU

No. 5 LSU contained 22nd-ranked Mississippi State, relied on its stellar defense and the right foot of placekicker **Cole Tracy** to earn a 19-3 victory on a wet Saturday night in Tiger Stadium. LSU (7-1, 4-1 SEC) built a 10-3 halftime lead before pitching a second-half shutout of Mississippi State (4-3, 1-3 SEC). Overshadowing the Tigers' fourth victory over ranked opponents in 2018 was a fourth-quarter targeting call on junior linebacker **Devin White** following a hit on Bulldogs' quarterback Nick Fitzgerald. White's penalty was confirmed by video review, he was ejected from the game and will miss the first half of the Tigers' next contest against No. 1 Alabama. White, safety **Grant Delpit** and linebacker **Jacob Phillips** each had 10 tackles against Fitzgerald and the run-heavy Bulldogs. Delpit had two of LSU's four interceptions along with a the Tigers' only sack. LSU running back **Nick Brossette** eclipsed 1,000 career yards and finished with 57 on 17 carries and the game's only touchdown. Quarterback **Joe Burrow** was 16-of-28 passing for 129 yards with an interception. Eight different receivers had catches for the Tigers, and **Dee Anderson** led the way with three receptions for 29 yards. Placekicker Tracy continued to move up the LSU record book, becoming the first Tiger to kick nine field goals in a two-game span. Tracy made all four of his attempts - 25, 38, 29 and 40 yards - and now had 21 field goals in 2018. Fitzgerald finished with 131 rushing yards, but only had 79 on 20 carries after ripping off 53 on consecutive runs on the Bulldogs' second drive of the game. He was 8-of-24 passing for 59 yards, 40 of which came on his final drive of the night. Running back Kylin Hill added 42 yards for the Bulldogs. LSU wore a unique uniform for the contest, a tribute to the 1918 "Silent Season" which was canceled due to World War I.

No. 1 Tide Hands Football First Home Loss

Top-ranked Alabama clinched the Southeastern Conference Western Division, defeating third-ranked LSU on a deafening Saturday Night in Tiger Stadium, 29-0. The Tide (9-0, 6-0 SEC) handled the raucous environment and a capacity crowd to hand LSU its second loss of the season. Playing the first half without junior linebacker Devin White, LSU fell behind 16-0 at the break. The Tide added to its lead with touchdowns in the third and fourth quarters. LSU's offense struggled to maintain drives, managing 196 yards of total offense against Alabama's 576. Quarterback **Joe Burrow** finished 18-of-35 passing for 184 yards with an interception in the Alabama end zone. He was sacked five times. His top target was **Justin Jefferson**, who had six catches for 81 yards. Running back **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** added 38 receiving yards on two catches. Alabama quarterback Tua Tagovailoa completed 25-of-42 passes for 295 yards with two touchdowns and his first interception of the season. He had three rushes for 49 yards including a 44-yard touchdown run. Alabama running back Damien Harris rushed 19 times for 107 yards with a touchdown, while Najee Harris added 83 yards on six carries. For the first time this season, Alabama did not score a touchdown on its opening offensive possession. The Tide drove to the LSU 14 before the Tigers' defense pushed Alabama back to the 34-yard line on the next three plays, forcing a punt. Alabama, however, moved 78 yards in five plays on its next possession to take a 6-0 lead. Quarterback Tua Tagovailoa connected with wide receiver Henry Ruggs on a 15-yard scoring pass, but the PAT attempt by placekicker Joseph Bulovas was missed. The Tide increased the lead to 9-0 at the 6:59 mark of the second quarter when Bulovas hit a 23-yard field goal, capping a 15-play, 75-yard march. Tagovailoa was intercepted for the first time this season with 3:27 left in the first half when safety **Todd Harris** picked off a pass intended for wide receiver Jerry Jeudy at the LSU five-yard line. LSU, which entered the game with a nation's-best 14 interceptions, has recorded a pick in 11 straight games dating back to last season. Tagovailoa fired a 25-yard TD pass to tight end Irv Smith to culminate a two-play, 54-yard drive with 1:15 remaining in the first half, giving the Tide a 16-0 advantage. Alabama extended the margin 22-0 at the 5:14 mark of the third quarter when Tagovailoa dashed 44 yards for a touchdown, completing a seven-play, 72-yard drive. LSU lineman **Austin Deculus** blocked Bulovas' extra-point attempt after the TD run. Edwards-Helaire returned the ensuing Alabama kickoff 57 yards to the Crimson Tide 40, but the Tigers could not record a first down and were forced to punt. The Tigers drove deep into Alabama territory early in the fourth quarter, but placekicker **Cole Tracy** missed a 33-yard field goal with 10:45 remaining in the contest. It was just the third miss of the season for Tracy and his first miss from less than 53 yards. After the missed field goal, Alabama increased its lead to 29-0 when the Tide moved 80 yards on eight plays, finishing the drive with a two-yard TD burst by running back Damien Harris.

LSU Brings 'The Boot' Back to Louisiana

LSU built a 24-3 lead through three quarters and held off Arkansas in the closing minutes to keep "The Golden Boot" in Baton Rouge, 24-17, on a chilly Saturday night at Reynolds Razorback Stadium. LSU (8-2, 5-2 SEC) won its eighth game for the 19th-straight season. Arkansas, which scored its two touchdowns in the fourth quarter to make the game interesting, fell to 2-8 overall and 0-6 in SEC play. Despite several starters who weren't able to play or left the game with injuries, the Tigers dominated play for the better part of three quarters. Arkansas gained 125 of its 216 yards in the fourth quarter. Quarterback **Joe Burrow** completed 15-of-21 passes for 195 with a 40-yard touchdown to **Justin Jefferson**, who had a career effort with six grabs and 117 yards. Running back **Nick Brossette** (23 rushes, 90 yards) and **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** (17 rushes, 56 yards) scored touchdowns of 12 and 13 yards, respectively. LSU out-rushed Arkansas, 164-16. LSU held the ball for 35:47 and had a 359-216 advantage in total offense. The Tigers were 5-of-14 on third down, while holding Arkansas to 2-of-12. Safety **Grant Delpit** led LSU with six tackles, a sack and two pass breakups.

LSU Rolls Past Rice on Senior Night, 42-10

The No. 10 LSU football team racked up 552 offensive yards and held Rice to 198 yards to work its way to a 42-10 victory on a chilly Senior Night in Tiger Stadium Saturday. LSU (9-2, 5-2 SEC) built a 28-3 lead at halftime before the defense limited Rice to one touchdown in the second half. LSU outgained Rice 552-198 offensively. Rice held the ball for 35:33 of the contest while LSU recorded 24:27 in time of possession. The Tigers recorded 31 first downs and were 5-of-8 on third down conversions. Offensively, quarterback **Joe Burrow** finished the night with a career high completions and yards after passing 20-of-28 for 307 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore **Myles Brennan** entered the game midway through the third quarter and was 4-of-6 for 65 yards. **Foster Moreau** and **Derrick Dillon** led the receiving corps, each recording career-high five catches. Moreau had a touchdown with a career-high 73 yards, and **Stephen Sullivan** had a career-high 94 yards with a touchdown. Moreau's five catches gives him 46 career receptions, which puts him ninth all-time on LSU's career list of receptions by a tight end. Senior running back **Nick Brossette** ran the ball 14 times for 69 yards and two touchdowns. **Lanard Fournette** and **Clyde Edwards-Helaire** each recorded rushing touchdowns as well. The Tigers were led by **Devin White**, **Jacob Phillips**, **Jacoby Stevens** and **Michael Divinity Jr.** on the defensive front. White compiled nine tackles and Stevens, Phillips and Divinity each had seven. **Cole Tracy** was a perfect 6-of-6 on point after attempts, and **Avery Atkins** recorded six touchbacks on his six kickoffs.

LSU Comes Up Short in NCAA's Wildest Game, 74-72

In the highest-scoring and longest game in NCAA FBS history, the seventh-ranked LSU football team fell to No. 22 Texas A&M, 74-72, in seven overtimes on Saturday at Kyle Field. LSU (9-3, 5-3 SEC) looked to have the game won in regulation, however, a video review nullified an interception and allowed Texas A&M (8-4, 5-3 SEC) to force overtime with a last-second touchdown that tied the game at 31-31. There were 84 points scored in the extra periods, with the final two being a two-point conversion pass by Texas A&M's Kellen Mond to wide receiver Kendrick Rogers. The previous NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision record for combined points scored in a game was 137 (76-61 Pitt win over Syracuse). Quarterback **Joe Burrow** led the way for LSU, completing 25-of-38 passes for 270 yards with three touchdowns while rushing 29 times for 100 yards and three more scores. His touchdowns responsible for (6) and total plays (67) set new schools records. Running back **Nick Brossette** added 61 yards on 16 carries with a touchdown. **Justin Jefferson** led 11 LSU receivers with 63 yards on five catches with a touchdown. Linebacker Devin White set a career high with 17 total tackles. He was joined by JaCoby Stevens and Jacob Phillips with double-digit tackles at 14 and 11 respectively. Texas A&M out-gained LSU, 521-496, in a contest that lasted 4 hours, 53 minutes.
