



SEASON PREVIEW

Head coach Chuck Winstead is in his third season at the helm of the LSU Men's Golf program and leads one of the more talented young squads in the nation for 2007-08.

The LSU men's golf team opened the 2007-08 season on Sept. 10 in Chattanooga, Tenn., with a young squad that featured three highly-touted freshmen in the starting lineup at the Scenic City Invitational. With newcomers Andrew Loupe, John Peterson and Clayton Rotz each making their collegiate debut, the Tigers earned a fourth-place finish in the 17-team field with a 54-hole score of 2-over par 854. In fact, their 7-under 277 in the opening round was the lowest team total in relation to par by an LSU squad since 2001.

Senior standout Brian Noonan led the way for the Tigers with a 16th-place finish, while Rotz earned his first career top-20 finish by tying for 17th place. Peterson, who fired a team tournament low round of 4-under 67 in the first round, tied for 23rd place with Loupe following close behind in a tie for 34th in his LSU debut.

After a strong showing in their season opener, the Tigers traveled to Birmingham, Ala., on Sept. 24 to compete in the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate for the third straight season. Despite an outstanding individual performance by Rotz, the Tigers managed a 10th-place finish in the 12-team field at historic Shoal Creek Country Club. Rotz, who earned his first career top-20 finish at the Scenic City Invitational, showed his potential by finishing in the Top 10 for the first time as he posted a cumulative score of 1-under 215 to tie for fourth place.

The Tigers continued to build momentum as they earned their best tournament finish in more than two years with a runner-up finish at the Squire Creek Invitational in Choudrant, La., on Oct. 16. LSU, which posted a 54-hole total of 2-under 862 for the week, blistered the course at Squire Creek Country Club with a 7-under par 281 in the final round to match its best team score in relation to par of the fall season.

Rotz earned his second straight top-10 finish by tying for eighth place at 2-under 214 for the championship. Both Loupe and junior Jarrod Barsamian finished one shot back of Rotz in a tie for 11th place at 1-under 215 to earn their best career finish with their lowest tournament score in an LSU uniform. The trio helped lead the Tigers to their highest finish since winning the team title at the 2005 Shoal Creek Intercollegiate in Birmingham on Sept. 27, 2005.

The Tigers wrapped up the fall season in late October with a pair of sixth-place finishes at the ClubGlove Intercollegiate in Somis, Calif., on Oct. 23 and the UNCG Bridgestone Collegiate Championship in Greensboro, N.C., on Oct. 30. Rotz and Peterson each finished in a tie for 17th place at the ClubGlove Intercollegiate, while Loupe led the effort at the Bridgestone Collegiate Championship by tying for 11th place.

Head coach Chuck Winstead wanted to provide his young squad with an opportunity to gain valuable experience during the fall season, and he did just that as Loupe, Peterson and Rotz each cracked the starting lineup in all five tournaments during the campaign. The trio has helped provide LSU with one of the more talented young squads in all of college golf as it finished the fall season ranked as the No. 4 freshman class in the country according to Golfstat. In addition, Noonan helped provide the lineup with consistency as he also made five tournament appearances during the fall season.

While the Tigers have already enjoyed a taste of success this season, they will be counting on many others to contribute during the spring if they hope to advance to the NCAA Regionals for the first time since 2005. Barsamian, senior Beck Troutman and sophomores Brent Blaum and Bryant Lach have already filled the No. 5 spot in the lineup this season, while senior Garrett Runion, junior

Brent Struthers, sophomore Brian Leveille and redshirt freshman Thomas Galloway eagerly await their opportunity to contribute to the Tigers' success in the spring.

The spring season kicks off Feb. 9-10 as the Tigers make their annual trip to Gainesville, Fla., to compete in the Gator Invitational at the newly renamed Mark Bostick Golf Course. The squad earned a 12th-place finish in the event last year after capturing its last team title in the event in 2002. The Tigers will then open the month of March with a return trip to the state of Florida as they will appear in the Seminole Intercollegiate for the second straight season. Florida State will play host to the event at Golden Eagle Golf Club in Tallahassee from March 2-4. The Tigers enjoyed their best finish of the spring season at the Seminole Intercollegiate a year ago by placing eighth in the 15-team field.

After appearing in the Seminole Intercollegiate, LSU will break for two weeks before making its annual trek to Forest Heights Country Club in Statesboro, Ga., to compete against a strong 18-team field in the prestigious Schenkel/E-Z-Go Invitational. This year's championship is scheduled to be held March 14-16 with Georgia Southern serving as host. The Tigers are also scheduled to compete in the Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate for the third straight season as the tournament will be held from March 23-25 at Bulls Bay Golf Club in Awendaw, S.C.

Following its appearance in the Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate, the squad will have one last opportunity to prepare for the 2007 Southeastern Conference Men's Golf Championships as it joins 14 other teams from across the South in the inaugural Reunion Intercollegiate. Conference rival Ole Miss will play host to the event as it will be held from April 7-8 at Reunion Golf and Country Club in Jackson, Miss.

The SEC Championships return to St. Simons Island, Ga., for the eighth straight season with Frederica Golf Club playing host to the event from April 18-20. The championship will be held at Frederica Golf Club for the first time after calling the Seaside Course at nearby Sea Island Golf Club its home for the last

seven years. LSU looks to improve upon a ninth-place finish from a year ago and make a return to the NCAA Regionals for the first time since the 2004-05 season.

The NCAA Regionals are scheduled to begin May 15 with UT-Chattanooga playing host to the East Regional at Council Fire Golf Club in Chattanooga, Tenn., while Ohio State will play host to the Central Regional at the Scarlet Golf Course in Columbus, Ohio, and Washington will play host to the West Regional at Gold Mountain Golf Club in Bremerton, Wash. The top 10 teams from each region will advance to compete in the 2008 NCAA Men's Golf Championships at Boilermaker Golf Club in West Lafayette, Ind., beginning May 28.



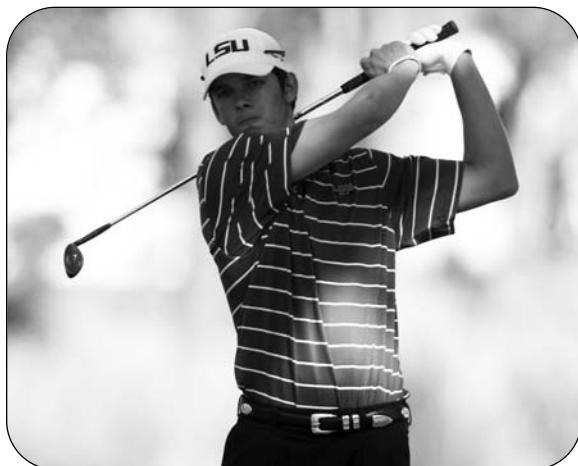

Golf Magazine Top 100 Teacher Golf Digest's No. 1 Teacher in Louisiana

Chuck Winstead enters his third season as the head coach of his alma mater and is well on his way to leading the LSU men's golf program back to the pinnacle of college golf.

Winstead inherited a program that had won four NCAA and 15 Southeastern Conference titles in its illustrious history, but the Tigers have not made an appearance in the NCAA Championships since 1997. He is determined to turn LSU into a perennial contender at both the SEC and NCAA Championships during his tenure.

Winstead knows that will not be an easy task, but he believes that LSU has the potential and the resources to become one of the elite programs in the nation.

"LSU Golf has a great and storied history," Winstead said. "Although it's been many years since we've enjoyed that type of success, I believe we've added the type of players to our team that can lay the foundation for future success and bring LSU Golf back to the forefront of college golf."

Winstead, who played at LSU from 1989-91 and is a native of Ruston, La., believes that the foundation of any successful program is built on recruiting the best high school athletes the sport has to offer, and he has already established himself as one of the nation's top recruiters in his short time as a head coach at the collegiate level.

In November 2006, Winstead signed one of the nation's premier recruiting classes as prep standouts Andrew Loupe (Baton Rouge, La.), John Peterson

(Fort Worth, Texas) and Clayton Rotz (Chambersburg, Pa.) decided to continue their careers in Baton Rouge.

Each was considered the top recruit in his home state for the Class of 2007, and the group has displayed its unlimited potential after finishing the fall season as the fourth-ranked freshman class in the country according to Golfstat. Each has cracked LSU's starting lineup in each of the first five tournaments to open the 2007-08 season.

In addition, the trio helped lead the Tigers back into the national rankings this past fall as the squad was ranked as high as No. 23 in the country in the Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index, marking the first time that LSU has cracked the national rankings since 2004.

Winstead continued to build momentum on the recruiting trail in November 2007 as he inked a recruiting class ranked No. 4 in the nation for the Class of 2008 according to Golfweek. National blue chippers Sang Yi (Carrollton, Texas), Josh Jones (The Colony, Texas) and Austin Gutsell (Mandeville, La.) signed with LSU and will be eligible to compete for the Tigers beginning in the 2008-09 season.

Yi was the 12th-ranked junior golfer in the country and the 10th-ranked prospect in the Class of 2008 when he signed, while Jones was the nation's 19th-ranked junior golfer and the 16th-ranked player in his classification according to the Golfweek Junior Rankings. Gutsell was also one of the nation's

Top 100 recruits for the Class of 2008 as he was ranked No. 89 in the country. "LSU Golf will be a nationally competitive program again as we attract elite high school golfers to LSU and provide an environment for improvement that is second to none," Winstead said. "We will provide our players with the opportunity to be the best they can be. There will be no program in the country where a young man can go and have the resources he will find at LSU. We are on the cutting-edge in all facets of the game and, as a result, our players will have every opportunity to achieve greatness."

In just his first season as LSU's head coach, Winstead guided the Tigers to their best finish at the SEC Championships in four years as the squad placed sixth in 2006. They followed by finishing ninth at the nation's most competitive conference tournament in 2007.

The Tigers have also enjoyed individual success under Winstead's tutelage as former LSU standout Chris Wells was a Second-Team All-SEC selection following the 2007 season, while he also earned PING All-Southeast Region honors this past spring. In addition, LSU's student-athletes have earned 14 Academic All-SEC honors over the past two seasons under Winstead.

"We've had a nice run our first two years here," Winstead said. "Our players have improved and, as a consequence, their scoring averages are continuing to drop. This certainly bodes well given the talented young men that are headed to Baton Rouge to join our program. We are positioned in the short run to see quite a change in LSU Golf."

Winstead is considered one of the top teaching professionals in the country and has been a Golf Magazine Top 100 Teacher since 2005, joining the likes of Butch Harmon, Peter Kostis, Jim Flick and former LSU standout and recent LSU Hall of Fame inductee Eddie Merrins. In addition, Golf Digest has recognized Winstead as Louisiana's Top Teacher since 2006.

He has been featured on The Golf Channel and frequently appearance in such publications as Golf Magazine and Golf Tips Magazine for which he serves as Senior Instruction Editor.

Winstead's credentials include a five-year association with Jack Nicklaus' Golden Bear Golf, Inc., in North Palm Beach, Fla., where he served as Director of Instruction for Golden Bear Golf among other things. In this role, Winstead served as part of the senior management team responsible for developing, managing and initiating the start-up of Jack Nicklaus Golf Academies throughout the world.

Prior to moving to the University Club in 2000 where he served as Director of Instruction and owner of the Chuck Winstead Golf Academy for five years prior to being named the Tigers' head coach, Winstead served as Director of Instruction at English Turn Golf and Country Club in New Orleans from 1998-2000. In addition, he also served as the head instructor for the Bob Toski Golf Learning Center in Sunrise, Fla., from 1993-95.

Winstead graduated from LSU in 1991. He and his wife, Jennifer, are the proud parents of two sons - Trey, 9, and David, 6 - and are active members of First United Methodist Church in Baton Rouge.

Shane Warren enters his third season as an assistant coach with the LSU men's golf program as he is responsible for assisting third-year head coach Chuck Winstead in LSU's recruiting efforts, coordinating practice sessions, providing assistance at tournaments and handling all day-to-day responsibilities with the team.

Warren served in the same capacity with head coach Karen Bahnsen and the nationally-ranked LSU women's golf program from 2003 through the end of the 2006 season. Widely considered one of the top assistant coaches in Division I college golf, the National Golf Coaches Association Board of Directors named Warren the 2004-05 NCGA Assistant Coach of the Year in July 2005.

"Two years ago I saw this as a fantastic opportunity for me. It has proven to be that and so much more," Warren said. "I'm one of the fortunate few to wake up everyday and do something that I love and am passionate about. The opportunity to work alongside Chuck in this capacity and continue to learn from him has been everything I was

hoping it would be. There is no place like LSU. It is truly special, and I'm excited about what lies ahead for LSU men's golf."

Warren demonstrated his recruiting prowess this past year as he helped LSU ink its best signing class in more than a decade and one of the nation's premier signing classes for the Class of 2007. The Tigers welcome standouts Andrew Loupe (Baton Rouge, La.), John Peterson (Fort Worth, Texas) and Clayton Rotz (Chambersburg, Pa.) as each was considered the top high school recruit in their respective states this past year.

A native of Tuscaloosa, Ala., Warren came to LSU in 2003 after serving as an assistant coach for the Alabama women's golf program from 1999-2002 and as an instructor for the Chuck Winstead Golf Academy at the University Club in 2003. Under his guidance, the Lady Tigers went from a program that was ranked 55th nationally when he joined the staff to one that was ranked among the nation's top-10 in his last two seasons with the team.

Prior to his stints at Alabama and LSU, Warren served two years as the assistant golf professional at Hidden Meadows Golf Club in Northport, Ala., and one year as the head golf instructor at the Golden Bear Golf Center in Fort Lauderdale, Fla. He also served as an associate golf professional at Lago Mar Country Club in Plantation, Fla., and as an instructor for the Mark Wood Golf Learning Center in Fort Lauderdale.

The 37-year-old Warren graduated from the University of Alabama with a degree in sports and fitness management in 1994. He married the former Lauren Burger of New Orleans on March 10, 2007.

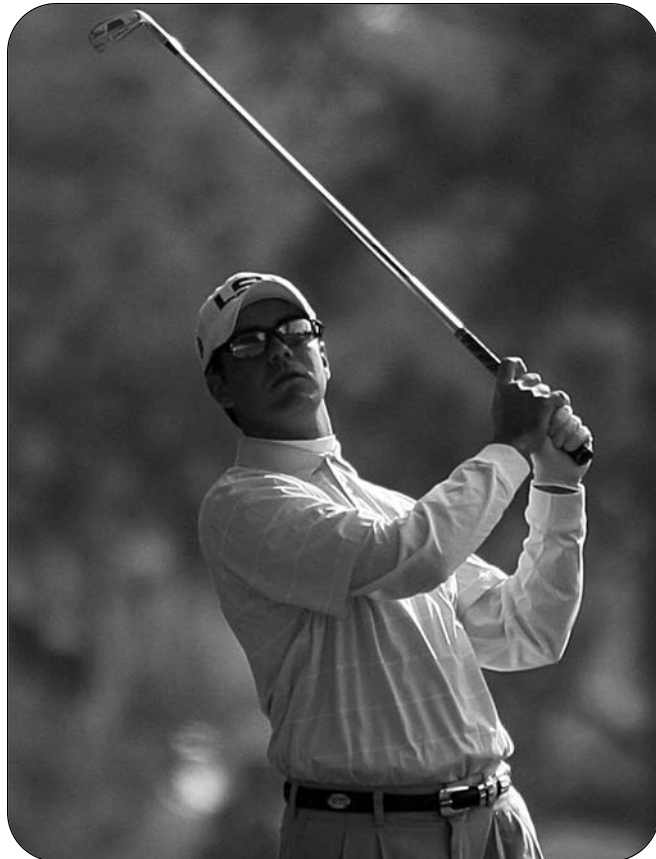

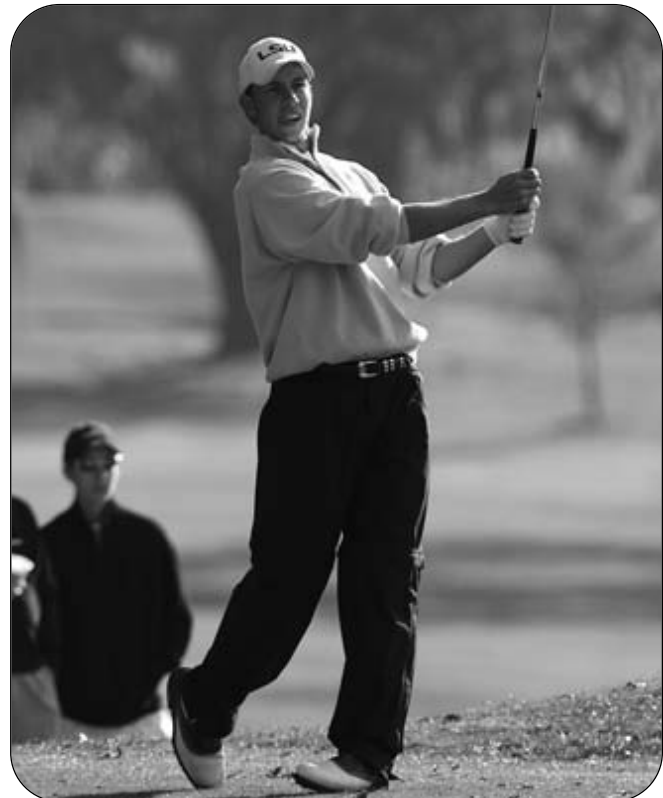

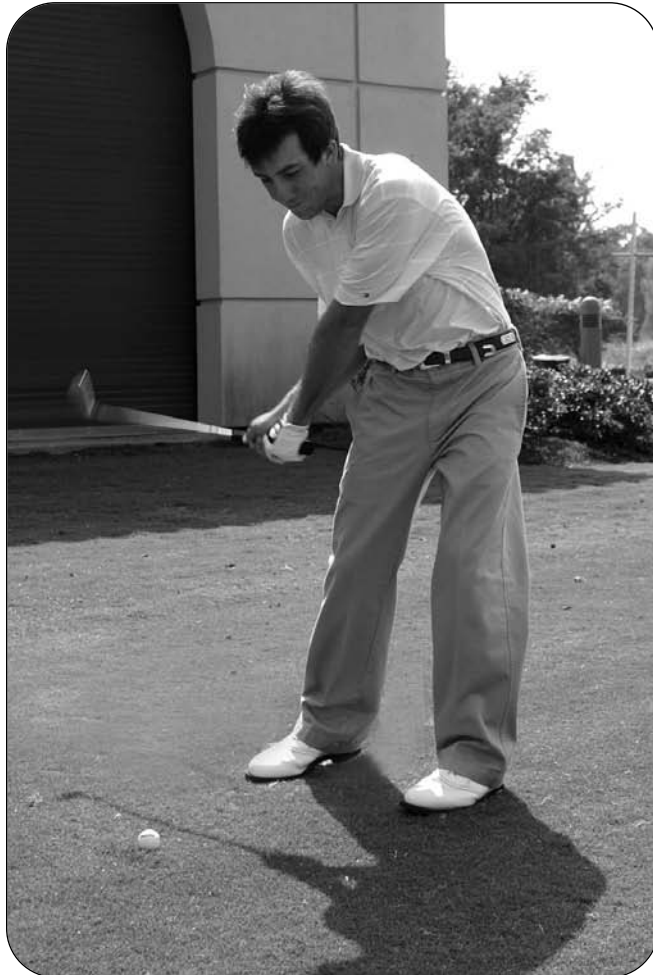

SEASON REVIEW

The 2006-07 season opened with much promise for the LSU men's golf team as all-conference standout Chris Wells returned for his senior season to lead a group of Tigers in their second season under the direction of head coach Chuck Winstead. Wells responded to the challenge of being the team's lone senior by earning second-team All-SEC accolades for the second time in three years, leading the team with a 73.0 scoring average as he was one of just two Tigers to appear in all 10 tournaments on the campaign.

Wells proved to be the Tigers' top performer during his three-year career in the purple and gold as he cracked the starting lineup in 33 straight tournaments while wrapping up his career in Baton Rouge with a team-leading nine top-10 finishes and a 73.1 stroke average during that span. In addition to his success on the course, Wells was named to the 2007 SEC Good Works Team and a member of the SEC Academic Honor Roll by the league for the second time.

The season also saw the emergence of junior Brian Noonan, who improved his scoring average by nearly three strokes from his sophomore year and finished right behind Wells with a 73.2 average in 10 tournament starts. The native of Austin, Texas, led the squad with two top-10 and six top-20 finishes, while also carding a team best 12 rounds at par or better.

Noonan was also the team's top finisher at the 2007 SEC Men's Golf Championships as the tournament returned to Sea Island Golf Club in St. Simons Island, Ga., for the seventh straight year. With LSU finishing in ninth place in the team standings, Noonan was the lone Tiger to finish among the top-20 individuals as he carded a 54-hole score of 11-over 221 to wrap up the championship in a tie for 16th place.

The Tigers opened the season with a trip to Birmingham, Ala., from Sept. 25-26 to compete in the Shoal Creek Intercollegiate and tied for 11th place with a 54-hole score of 37-over 901. Despite their finish in the team standings, Noonan led the way for the Tigers with his best career finish as he was the tournament's runner-up while firing a career

low tournament score of 2-under 214. It also marked the first top-10 finish of his LSU career.

The team returned to action in one of the premier tournaments in all of college golf with an appearance in the annual Jerry Pate National Intercollegiate hosted by the University of Alabama from Oct. 9-10. The Tigers finished in sole possession of ninth place with a team total of 9-under 843 as it was the team's lowest tournament score in relation to par since recording a 9-under 855 in the 2002 Mercedes Benz Collegiate Championship. Wells led the way with his first top-10 finish of the season as he tied for sixth with a career-low 8-under 205.

LSU wrapped up a brief fall season with an appearance in the inaugural Oklahoma Intercollegiate at historic Oak Tree from Oct. 15-17, finishing fourth in the eight-team field for its first top-five finish of the season. Noonan and true freshman Brent Blaum led the way as the duo tied for ninth place in the individual standings at 13-over 226 for the championship. It was Noonan's second Top 10 of the fall slate while Blaum earned the first of his collegiate career.

Although his team was out of action for nearly four months, Winstead continued to build a strong foundation for the future success of the program during the winter break by inking one of the nation's premier signing classes on Nov. 16. Winstead added the services of such prep standouts as Andrew Loupe (Baton Rouge, La.), John Peterson (Fort Worth, Texas) and Clayton Rotz (Chambersburg, Pa.) as each was considered the top high school recruit in their home state for the Class of 2007.

With the program building momentum following its success on National Signing Day, Winstead took his squad to Gainesville, Fla., to open the spring season with its annual appearance in the Gator Invitational from Feb. 10-11. The Tigers finished in 12th place in the 14-team field after posting a team total of 44-over 884 at the par-70 layout. They returned to action the following week to compete in the prestigious John Hayt Invitational (formerly the Mercedes-Benz

Collegiate Championship) in Ponte Vedra Beach, Fla., where they placed 15th.

The Tigers again returned to the state of Florida for their third tournament of the spring season with their first ever appearance in the Seminole Intercollegiate from March 4-6. The team earned a strong finish after placing eighth in the 15-team field with a three-round score of 23-over 887. Wells was outstanding throughout the tournament as he earned the best individual finish of his LSU career by tying for third place. The native of Mobile, Ala., fired rounds of 1-over 73, 1-under 71 and 3-under 69 for a 54-hole score of 3-under 213. His previous best was a fifth-place finish in the 2005 LSU Spring Invitational at The University Club.

Following its strong showing in the Seminole Intercollegiate, the squad finished 13th in the Schenkel/E-Z-Go Invitational on March 18 before ending the month with a trip to Awendaw, S.C., to compete in the third annual Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate. A strong 15-team field greeted the Tigers at Bulls Bay Golf Club as they finished the event in 10th place in the team standings, recording a three-round score of 18-over 870 at the par-71 layout. Wells led the effort for the third consecutive tournament as he posted his fourth top-20 finish of the season and 14th of his collegiate career after tying for 17th place.

After a one-month layoff following the Hootie at Bulls Bay Intercollegiate, the Tigers tee it up in perhaps the most competitive conference tournament in all of college golf with an appearance in the 2007 SEC Men's Golf Championships from April 20-22. The championship returned to the picturesque Seaside Course at Sea Island

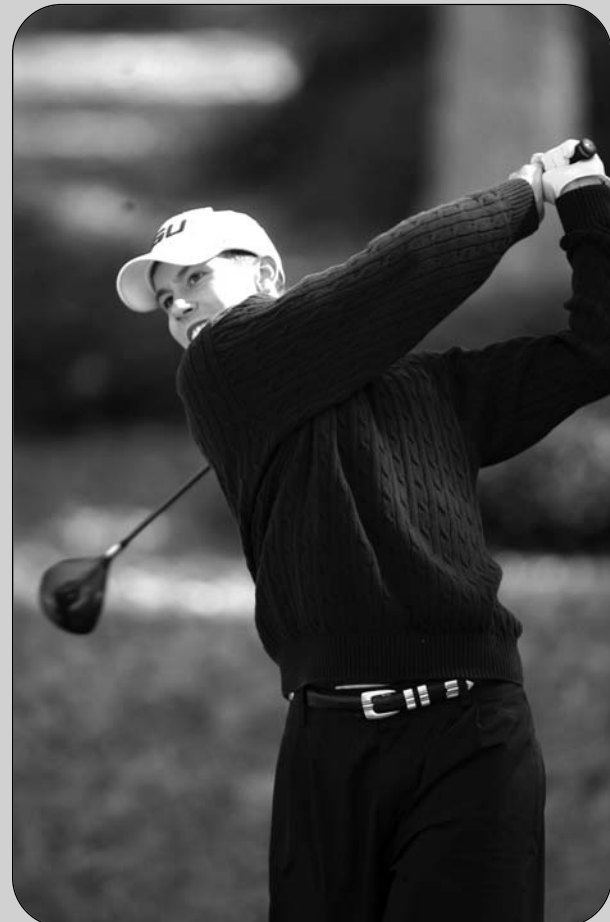
Golf Club in St. Simons Island, Ga., for the seventh straight season as the Tigers finished in ninth place with a team total of 52-over 892 for the weekend. The event is scheduled to return to St. Simons Island again in 2008 but will move to nearby Frederica Golf Club.

With NCAA Regional bids already handed out, LSU wrapped up the 2006-07 season with a return trip to the state of Georgia to tee it up in the Linger Longer Invitational from May 13-14. The Tigers were welcomed by another strong 15-team field as seven squads entered the final tournament of the regular season ranked among the nation's top 25 in the Golfweek/Sagarin Performance Index. Noonan and Wells each finished in a tie for 17th place after firing matching 1-under scores of 215 to lead LSU to a 13th-place finish in the team standings. Redshirt freshman Brian Leveille also made his collegiate debut in the event.

The Tigers continued to take steps in the right direction in Winstead's second season at the helm of the program. In addition to signing arguably the nation's top recruiting class during the fall signing period, Winstead coached his first all-conference performer with Wells earning second-team All-SEC recognition for the second time in his career. The Tigers excelled off the course as well as seven student-athletes were named to the 2007 SEC Academic Honor Roll, giving the Tigers 14 total Academic All-SEC selections in Winstead's two seasons as head coach.

SEC Golfers Are Leaders On The Links

Throughout the illustrious history of the Southeastern Conference the league has provided a strong tradition of excellence on the links with its men's golf programs, and the 2006-07 season was no different.

Georgia was the runner-up at the 2007 NCAA Men's Golf Championships and was joined among the top 10 teams in the event by sixth-place Alabama and ninth-place Florida. A trio of golfers also finished among the top 10 performers in the championship led by Michael Thompson of Alabama, who finished in a tie for fourth place in the individual standings.

The conference has captured 10 NCAA team titles in its history with four belonging to both LSU and Florida, while Georgia has added a pair of its own. A total of 40 SEC teams have finished in the top 10 in the NCAA Championships since 1985.

Individually, the SEC has witnessed six national champions with Florida's Nick Gilliam winning the latest title in 2001. In addition to winning six individual NCAA titles, 39 student-athletes have finished among the top 10 in the NCAA Championships since 1985.

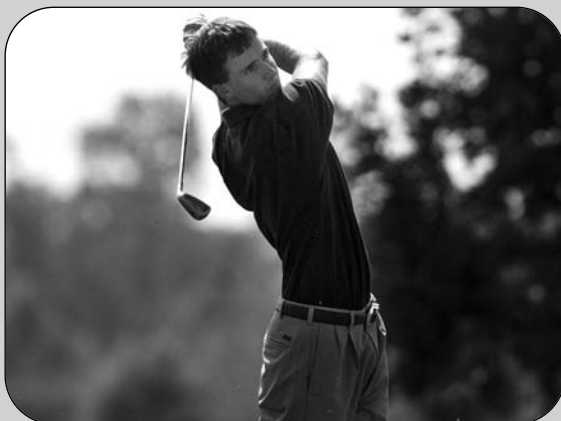

Three Former Tigers Represent LSU at PGA Championship

David Toms, Brian Bateman and Phil Schmitt teed it up against 156 of the game's best players at the 89th PGA Championship this past summer as the former LSU standouts entered the chase for "Glory's Last Shot" at Southern Hills Country Club in Tulsa, Okla. Toms won the only major championship of his illustrious career at the 2001 PGA Championship when he outlasted PGA Tour great Phil Mickelson for the title at the Atlanta Athletic Club in Duluth, Ga. Bateman made his second career start in a major championship at this year's PGA Championship, while Schmitt made his first career appearance since turning professional in 1996.

Bateman Earns First PGA Tour Win at 2007 Buick Open

Bateman earned his first career PGA Tour victory in July after sinking a 12-foot birdie putt on the 72nd hole at the 2007 Buick Open at Warwick Hills in Grand Blanc, Mich. Bateman, who turned professional in 1996 after a successful four-year career at LSU, fired a final round 3-under 69 to finish at 15-under 273 for the championship and one shot clear of three players already in the clubhouse hoping for a playoff. With the win, Bateman earned \$882,000, an exemption into the 2008 Masters Tournament and exempt status for the 2008 season.

Bateman a Candidate for PGA Tour's Comeback Player of the Year

When postseason award ballots were mailed to players following the 2007 season, Bateman was one of three finalists on the ballot for this year's PGA Tour Comeback Player of the Year. The Monroe native enjoyed his most successful season as a professional as he won his first career PGA Tour victory with a win at the 2007 Buick Open in July. Bateman, who earned the final card out of Q-School prior to the start of the 2007 season, finished 94th on the PGA Tour Money List with \$1,022,763 in earnings for the year. He has earned an exemption into the 2008 Masters Tournament and will compete with exempt status for the 2008 season.

Former Tiger Lee Wins U.S. Senior Amateur Title

Former LSU All-American Stan Lee became the youngest USGA Senior Amateur champion in history with his 4-and-3 win in the final match at the 2007 U.S. Senior Amateur Championship at Flint Hills National Golf Club in Andover, Kan., in September. Lee became the second former LSU golfer to win a USGA Amateur Championship at Flint Hills as Lady Tiger Meredith Duncan defeated Chile's Nicole Perrot in 37 holes to win the 2001 U.S. Women's Amateur title. Lee, who at 55 years and five days, surpassed the previous record of 55 years, three months and 18 days set by former U.S. Senior Amateur champion Bill Bosshard in 1991.

Toms Continues Major Championship Success in 2007

Toms has established himself as one of the elite performers on the PGA Tour since joining the professional ranks in 1992 and continued his outstanding performance in major championships during the 2007 season. The former LSU All-American earned back-to-back top-10 finishes in majors as he followed a ninth-place finish at the 2007 Masters Tournament in April by tying for fifth place at the 107th U.S. Open Championship in June. Toms has earned a total of eight top-10 finishes in major championships during his illustrious career. He was also one of three former Tiger standouts to compete in the 89th PGA Championship in July.

Toms Leads U.S. to Victory at The Presidents Cup

Not only did Toms enjoy a successful season in major championships in 2007, but he also helped the United States win its second straight Presidents Cup title in September as the team's leading scorer. Toms totaled 4.5 points for the week as the United States knocked off the International Team by a 19.5-14.5 margin. He posted a perfect 2-0-0 mark in foursomes, a 1-0-0 mark in singles and a 1-0-1 mark in four ball for a cumulative 4-0-1 mark in the four-day competition. Scott Verplank was the next highest scorer for the United States as he tallied four points on the week with a perfect 4-0-0 record during the competition.

Schmitt Among 20 PGA Professionals to Punch Ticket to PGA Championship

Schmitt was one of 20 golfers to receive an exemption to compete in the 89th PGA Championship as he earned a top-20 finish at the 40th PGA Professional National Championship in Sunriver, Ore., in June. Schmitt finished in a tie for ninth place in a field of 312 of the nation's top PGA Professionals to punch his ticket to the 2007 PGA Championship at Southern Hills Country Club in Tulsa, Okla. Schmitt, who is the PGA Head Professional at The Bluffs in St. Francisville, La., made his first career appearance in a major championship since turning pro in 1996 after a stellar collegiate career at LSU.

Sterling Earns PGA Tour Card for 2008 Season

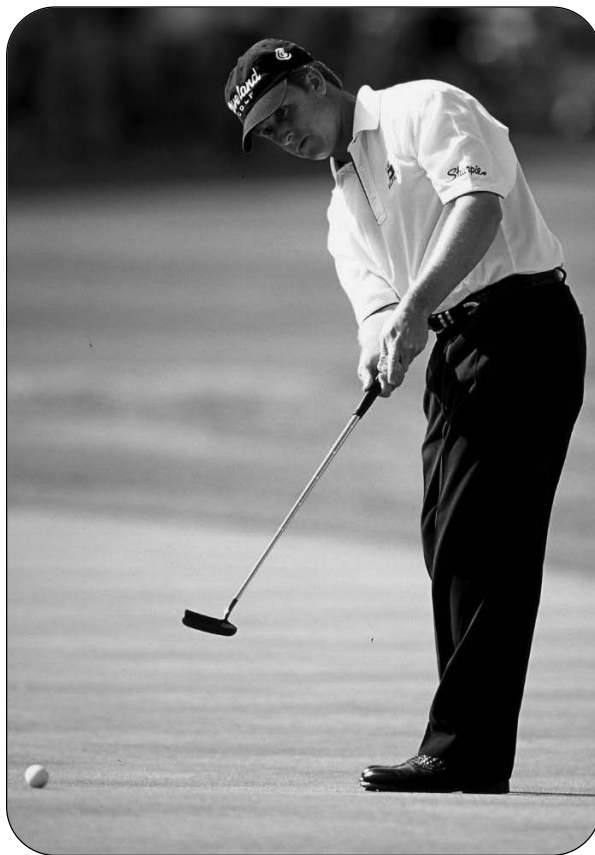
Former LSU All-American Scott Sterling was one of a record 25 players who secured a 2008 PGA Tour card in November after competing at the season-ending Nationwide Tour Championship at Barona Creek Golf Club in Lakeside, Calif. Sterling finished the season ranked No. 21 on the final money list for the Nationwide Tour with \$216,324 in earnings. He will join Toms and Bateman on the PGA Tour beginning in 2008. Sterling was an honorable mention All-American in 1994 and a two-time All-SEC selection during his collegiate career.

The Bertman Coaching **LEGACY**

Skip Bertman's unyielding desire to succeed drove him to the pinnacle of his profession, and his astute knowledge of the game -- obtained from over 40 years of coaching -- combined with his steadfast determination and irrepressible enthusiasm transformed LSU Baseball into the nation's premier program. Bertman has been inducted into the College Baseball Hall of Fame, the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame and the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

A Louisiana Legend and one of the greatest college baseball coaches of all time, J. Stanley "Skip" Bertman has made the seamless transition into the athletics director's chair with the same enthusiasm, vision and demand for excellence that were trademarks of his stellar coaching career.

The 2007-08 season will mark Bertman's final year as LSU athletics director. After his tenure ends on June 30, 2008, he will remain at LSU as athletics director emeritus through 2010, working as a vital fund-raiser for the university.

In six years as LSU's director of athletics, Bertman has added to his impressive list of on-the-field achievements. Under his direction, LSU has enjoyed arguably the greatest athletics seasons in the history of the institution.

The 2006-07 season saw 12 LSU teams finish among the nation's top 25, including a No. 3 final ranking for the football team and a fourth consecutive Final Four appearance by the women's basketball squad. The LSU men's and women's track and field teams each finished No. 2 in the nation.

In 2005-06, LSU joined North Carolina (1997-98) as the only schools to have their football, men's basketball and women's basketball teams all finish in the nation's Top 5. LSU in 2005-06 also became the first school in SEC history to win outright league championships in men's and women's basketball in the same season.

In 2004-05, 14 LSU teams advanced to the post-season, and in 2003-04, three teams won national championships, nine teams finished in the nation's top ten, and fourteen teams ranked in the top 25.

Under Bertman's direction, LSU teams have also recorded improved grade point averages across the board, making the student-athlete experience a success on and off the fields of competition.

While supervising the Tigers' progress on the playing fields, he has implemented measures necessary to realize his vision of building the LSU athletics department into the best in the country. Bertman's bold and innovative plans promise to keep the Tigers among the nation's elite in all phases of collegiate athletics.

Bertman is now in the midst of upgrading LSU's athletics complex, as he took the bold but essential move to implement a seat contribution program in Tiger Stadium to fund facility improvements and ensure the financial stability of the LSU Athletics Department for the next decade.

Working hand in hand with the Tiger Athletic Foundation, Bertman has already overseen the completion of the Cox Communications Academic Center for Student-Athletes, the renovation of Tiger Stadium and the Pete Maravich Assembly Center, and the construction of the Football Operations Center.

In addition, state-of-the-art baseball and softball stadiums are scheduled to be constructed by the fall of 2008, and a basketball practice facility will be in place by 2009.

Bertman was named LSU's athletics director on January 19, 2001. With Bertman, LSU gained an athletics director who provides the leadership and experience necessary to manage the Tigers' budget of over \$50 million.

Bertman guided LSU to five NCAA baseball titles during his 18-year coaching tenure (1984-2001), and his teams drew huge crowds to venerable Alex Box Stadium, as the Tigers led the nation in attendance in each of his final six seasons.

He also served as head coach of the 1996 U.S. Olympic team which captured the bronze medal in Atlanta.

Bertman continues to be honored for his remarkable coaching tenure, as he was inducted in June 2006 into the new College Baseball Hall of Fame as part of the hall's inaugural class. He has also been inducted into the Louisiana Sports Hall of Fame and the American Baseball Coaches Association Hall of Fame.

In a *Baseball America* poll published in 1999, Bertman was voted the second greatest college baseball coach of the 20th century, trailing only Rod Dedeaux of Southern California. Bertman, Dedeaux and Augie Garrido of Texas are the only coaches to win five CWS titles.

Bertman had previously earned recognition as one of the nation's brightest assistant coaches while at the University of Miami (Fla.) for eight seasons (1976-83). Before working at Miami, Bertman was renowned for his coaching excellence. In 11 seasons at Miami Beach High School, he directed the Hi-Tides to a state championship and two runners-up finishes and he was named Florida's Coach of the Year on three occasions.

In 1975, Bertman coached at Miami-Dade Downtown, leaving after one season to join legendary head coach Ron Fraser at Miami. The move was a homecoming of sorts, as Bertman spent his collegiate playing days with the Hurricanes as an outfielder and catcher from 1958-60. He earned his B.A. in health and physical education from Miami in 1961 and received his master's degree from UM in 1964.

Bertman and his wife Sandy are the parents of four daughters - Jan, Jodi, Lisa and Lori. The Bertmans have four grandchildren - Sophie Faith and Isaac Stanley, the children of Emile and Lori Bertman Guirard; and Samuel Aaron and Ezra Michael, the sons of Drew and Lisa Bertman Pate.
